John Hafsy of Greenville County being in perfect Health  
quitly of mind do make and ordain this my last Will  
and Testament in manner & form following, that is to say  
I impetratus, I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Hafsy  
One Negro girl by Name Aggy also One feather bed and  
furniture to her and her heirs or assigns forever. Item, I give  
and bequeath to my daughter Ann Hafsy One negro girl  
by name Aggy also One feather Bed and furniture to her, her  
heirs & assigns for ever. Item, I send to my loving wife  
Elizabeth Hafsy all the rest of my Estate of what nature so  
ever I have not already disposed of during her natural life  
or her widowhood and immediately after her Death or marriage  
my Will and desire is that the Estate so left my wife may  
be equally divided between my said two daughters Mary  
and Ann. To them, their heirs and assigns forever, Item,  
All that I have and devise is that my said daughters Mary and  
Ann may be perfectly and enjoy the legacies left them.

To die without issue my desire is that my Estate so left her  
may return to my other daughter, her heirs, and assigns upon  
Bastard either of my said daughters die leaving an issue of her  
body whether begotten in wedlock or not my Will and desire  
is that My Estate so left her may go to the said Issue and issue  
of her body to them, their heirs and assigns forever. My Will &  
desire is that my Estate be not apportioned among part, hereof  
sold, and lastly I constitute and appoint my loving wife  
Elizabeth Hafsy, whole & sole Executing of this my last Will  
and Testament revoking all other Wills by me heretofore made  
In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed  
my seal the day & date above written,

At a Court held for Greenville County the 27<sup>th</sup> day of October  
1791. This Will was proved according to Law by the Captains of  
the Wifeposses Hereto and ordered to be recorded, And on the Motion  
of Elizabeth Ufford, the Testatrix herein named who made this  
hereto and together with Willard Clegg and Braxton Robinson  
her executors entered into and acknowledged their Bond in the  
~~some thousand~~ sum of five hundred Pounds conditioned as the Law directs.  
Certificate was granted her for obtaining a Probate  
thereof in due form.
