John Massey of Greenville County being in perfect San-
guinity of mind do make and ordain this my last Will
and Testament in manner & form following, that is to say
In presence, I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Massey
one Negro Girl by Name Nanny also One feather bed and
Furniture to her and her heirs or assigns forever. Item, I give
and bequeath to my daughter Ann Massey One negro Girl
by name Nanny also One Feather Bed and Furniture to her, her
heirs & assigns forever. Item, I lend to my loving Wife
Elizabeth Massey all the rest of my Estate of what nature so
kind never yet already disposed of during her natural life
or widowhood and immediately after her Death or marriage
my Will and desire is that the Estate so lent my Wife may
be equally divided between my said two daughters Mary
and Ann. To them, their heirs and assigns forever. Item,
My Will and desire is that my said daughters Mary and
Ann may be respected by and enjoy the legacies left them.

To die without issue my desire is that my Estate so left her
may return to my other daughters, her heirs, and assigns forever.
But if either of my said daughters die leaving an issue of her
body whether begotten in Wedlock or not my Will and desire
is that My Estate so left her may go to the said Issue or Issue
of her body to them, their heirs and assigns forever. My Will &
desire is that my Estate be not appraised nor any part thereof
sold, and lastly I constitute and appoint my loving Wife
Elizabeth Maffey whole & sole Executrix of this my last Will
and Testament revoking all other Wills by me heretofore made
In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed
my seal this day & date above written.

At a Court held for Greensville County the 27th day of October 1791. This Will was proved according to Law by the Oaths of the Witnesses Thereto, and ordered to be recorded. And on the Motion of Elizabeth Massey the Executrix Therin named who made Oath Thereto and together with Micell Ezell and Braxton Robinson her securities entered into and acknowledged their Bond in the ^{sum of one thousand} Penalty of five hundred Pounds conditioned as the Law directs. Certificate was granted her for obtaining a Probate thereof in due form.
