In the name of God, amen, I John Mofs of the County of Greenville and State of Virginia being sick of Body but of perfect mind and memory do make this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following. — Item I give to my beloved Wife Susanna Mofs during her natural life the plantation whereon I now live together with all my Stock of every kind and Household and Kitchen furniture and plantation utensils and likewise the following Negroes to wit, Jacob, America, Cherry and Ted, that is to say during her natural life or Widowhood. — Item I give to my two eldest Sons Leato Mofs and John Mofs all that Tract of Land lying and being in the Counties of Greenville and Brunswick whereon my Father Thomas Mofs now lives containing Two Hundred and Fifty four Acres more or less being the Tract of Land Purchased of David Walton to be equally divided between them at the death of my Father Thomas Mofs to them and their heirs forever. — Item I give to my Sons Bashora Mofs and Ransome Mofs at the death of my beloved Wife, the Tract of Land whereon I now live, (which I mean both on this estate and that devised to my Wife) to include the Land Purchased of William Rainey, these two Tracts containing

my last Will and Testament in manner and form following. — Item I give to
my beloved Wife Susanna Moss during her natural life the plantation whereon
I now live together with all my Stock of every kind and Household and Kitchen
furniture and plantation utensils and likewise the following Negroes to wit,

Marionne Moss — I Give I constitute and appoint my beloved
Wife Susanna Moss Executrix and Guardian to my children together
with my friend William Walker and Brother William Moss. —
