First my Will and desire is that after this Year my Negroes to wit Locomina, Billy, & Peggy shall be hired out yearly until Hinchia Pettway (son of my Brother Robert Pettway deceased) comes of the Age of Twenty One Years, and the Money arising from their hire, ^{to be appropriated} towards boarding, clothing, and Schooling the aforesaid Hinchia Pettway, and James B. Pettway another son of my Deceased Brother Robert Pettway. Secondly My Will and desire is that as soon as the aforesaid Hinchia Pettway arrives to the Age of Twenty One Years, that the aforesaid

218) Three Negroes, and their increase, if any, shall be sold, and the Money
arising from the sale thereof to be equally divided between the aforesaid
Hinchia, and James B. Pettway. Thirdly, It is my Will & Desire
that my Executors hereafter named shall keep my Negroes employed
at the carpenters Business until the end of this Year, and the Money
arising from their Work to be applied to the benefit of the aforesaid
Hinchia, and James B. Pettway. Fourthly, It is my Will & Desire
that all the remainder of my property (not yet given away) shall
be sold on Twelve Months Credit. Fifthly, It is my further Will &
Desire that my Executors pay Polly P. Pettway (daughter of my
brother Benjamin Pettway) One Hundred and Fifty Dollars, when
she Marries or comes of Age. Sixthly, It is my Will and Desire
