 John Pinner an equal part of my Estate that is sold to be divided
 amongst all my children provided he lives to the Age of twenty one
 years but if he dies before he arrives to that age I give it to Thomas
 Phillips Senr. Item I give and bequeath all the remainder of my
 Estate that I have not given away heretofore to be sold and equally
 divided amongst all my children now living Thomas Phillips,
 Priscilla Jackson, Elizabeth Gordon, Polly Ingram, Sarah Walton to
 them and their heirs forever, and lastly I nominate and appoint
 my son Thomas Phillips my whole and sole executor of this my last
 Will and Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my
 Hand and Seal this Ninth Day of May One Thousand Seven Hundred
 and Ninety Seven.
