James Stewart Deceased my Negroe Woman called Bett to her and her
heirs for ever. Also I give and bequeath unto my Niece Sarah Stewart

Daughter of James Stewart Deceased my Negroe Woman called Sarah
to her and her and her heirs for ever. Also I give and bequeath unto

Hezia Thorp Daughter of Lewis Thorp forty Pounds Specie, to her and
her heirs for ever. Also I give and bequeath unto Joseph Thorp Son of

Thomas Morris his Security entered into and acknowledged their Bond
in the Penalty of five thousand Pounds conditioned as the Law directs
Certificate was granted him for obtaining a Patent therefor in due form.
