and calling to mind the Mortality of my Body as knowing it is appointed
for all men to die, do dispose of the Worldly Estate the Lord hath blessed me
with in the following manner. Viz. I HEREBY I lend to my loving Wife Ann
Clark all my Estate of what kind or nature whatever during the time
she continues my Widow and that there be no appraisement nor Sale
but that my Wife have peaceable possession of the whole until the above
said time and then all to be equally divided between my two Sons John and
Joshua including my Land and the Negroe Girl Lidd. and her increase
after each of my Brothers and Sisters have received a child a piece if
she should live to have as many according to my Grand Fathers request
and that they be delivered to each at the Age of Nine Months so upon their
paying the expence of Midwife and other Charges for the Months
Lying in. I Ordain this my last Will and Testament revoking all
others I appoint my Wife Ann Clark and Howell Vick Executors to
this my last Will. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and Seal this Seventeenth day of May 1702.

At a Court held for Greenville County the 27th day of June 1782. This will
was proved by the Oath of Peter Wyche a Witness thereto And on the
Motion of Howell Vick the Executor therein named who made Oath thereto
and together with Henry Mangum his Security entered into and ac-
knowledgeed their Bond in the Penalty of one thousand Dollars conditioned
as the Law directs Certificate was granted him for obtaining a Probate
thereof in due form Liberty being reserved for the Executors therein named
to join in the said Probate when she may think fit And at a Court held for the
said County the 25th Day of July following This said Will was proved by the
Oath of Henry Wyche the other Witness thereto and ordered to be recorded.
