Will and Testament. Item I give and bequeath to my Son George
Clarke the following Named Negroes: - Negroe Man Ned, a boy
Simon, a boy Benjamin, a Negroe Girl Mourning, a Girl named
Fanny, to his Daughter a Feather bed and furniture, One Grey
Horse to him and his heirs for ever. Item I give and bequeath
to my Son Benjamin Clark part of the Tract of Land now
lived upon Beginning at the mill field, thence by a line of
marked

Mark'd Trees to Samuel Clarke line, the lower part of my
 Plantation to him and his heirs forever. I desire my Wife to
 have her life time on said Plantation. Also I give my Son
 Benjamin Clark a Negroe Man Jacob, a Boy Daniel, a Girl
 Diana, a Girl Sylvia, and all their increase, a Brandy Still,
 I also give my Son Benjamin Clark one Feather Bed and fur-
 niture, One Grey Mare, to him and his heirs forever. Item I give
 and bequeath to my Son Peters Clark the remainder part of the
 track of Land I now live upon, One Negroe Boy named Jeffry

It is my Will and desire that if either of my three youngest Children should die, before they come of Age, or without Lawful Issue, that their Estate be equally divided amongst the surviving of the three mentioned, If the three Young children above mentioned should die before they come of Age, or Lawful Issue, then their Estate to be equally divided amongst all my surviving children. It is my desire that my Friend John Pitchett and my Son George Clark be Executors of this my last Will and Testament. and I do hereby disannull all former Wills and Testaments and no other to be my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seal this second day of March in the Year of our Lord Christ One thousand, Seven hundred Eighty Nine

and John Pitchett his securities entered into and acknowledged
their Bond in the penalty of five thousand Pounds, Conditions
as the Law directs Certified as granted him ^{obtain} for a Probate
thereof in due form Liberty being reserved for the other Executor
therein named to join in the said Probate when he may think fit
