bequeath to my beloved Son Joseph Parks all the remainder of my Land
containing two hundred and eleven Acres more or less to him his heirs and
assigns for ever. It is my Will and desire that if either of my Sons die
without heir his part of Land devolve to him who is to go to my Son
Henry Parks to him his heirs and assigns for ever. I do hereby appoint
my loving Sons Major Parks and Joseph Parks to that effect as Executors to
this my last Will and Testament.
