

In the name of God Amen I Leake Jones of the County of Greeneville  
being sick but possessed of a strong mind and memory and calling to mind that  
it is appointed for me once to die do make this my last Will and Testament revoking  
and disannulling all other wills formerly made and to what worldly  
goods God hath been gracious to bestow upon me I do give in manner  
and form following after my just debts being paid. Item I give to my  
niece Rebecca Maclin one grey Mare and a riding chair also one  
feather Bed and furniture the Mare to be delivered her Christmas 1796.  
The Colt the Mare now goes with I give to Thomas Maclin with the use  
of the said Mare until the above period of Christmas 1796. Item I give to  
my niece Elizabeth Maclin one half of the Bonds due me. Item I give to  
my niece Susanna Maclin the other half of the Bonds due me, my  
trunks and wearing apparel I desire that my sister Elizabeth's Maclin  
may have such as she may want and the balance for her to divide  
between Rebecca, Elizabeth, and Susanna Maclin, when the Bonds is  
collected I desire that Thomas Maclin who is guardian for Elizabeth and  
Susanna Maclin may from time to time dispose of the money for such  
articles as he may conceive they stand in need of. Lastly I appoint

Susanina Maclin may from time to time dispose of the money for such articles as he may conceive they stand in need of. Lastly I appoint John Maclin and Thomas Maclin Executors of this my last Will Testament and desire that there may be no appearance of my Estate to the contrary. Given under my hand and seal this tenth day of November one thousand seven hundred and ninety five.

Greensville County Court July 1796 This Will was proved according to Law by the Oaths of the Witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of John Maclin one of the Executors therein named who made oath thereto and with Thomas Maclin his Security entered <sup>into</sup> and acknowledged Bond in the penalty of six hundred Pounds conditioned as the Law directs Certificate was granted him for obtaining a Probate thereof in due form.
