 to make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form as follows
 Viz: First and Principally I recommend my Soul to the Mercy of our mighty God
 that gave it, hoping a gracious reception of the same and also that worthy good will
 hath pleased God to endow me with, His Grace upon the following manner Viz: First
 I premise and bequeath to my wife Elizabeth Dupree my whole Estate, Personal and
 Real, untill my son Henry Dupree arrived to the age of twenty one Years according
 to each of my Children a Negro in manner as follows. I Give to my Daughter
 Polly Dupree a Negro girl named Fenny. Item I Give to my Daughter Elizabeth
 Dupree, a Negro Boy named Ned. Item I Give to my Daughter Hannah
 Dupree, a Negro Boy named Ben. Item I Give to my Daughter Faith
 Dupree, a Negro Boy named London. Item I Give to son Henry Dupree, a
 Negro Boy called Buck, and if either of the above mentioned Negroes should die
 that my Estate shall make it good to the Legatees. And that if either of my above
 mentioned Children should die without their Lawfully begotten, My Will and desire
 is for the Negro given them to return to my Estate again, and that with the residue of my
 Estate to remain in the possession of my wife during her natural life, and after her
 death to be equally divided amongst my Children, excepting my Land which
 my Will and desire is that my son Henry Dupree shall have the whole of the same
 My Will and desire is that it may be House and home for my Children untill they
 shall marry or come of Lawful Age. My Will and desire is that if the Admin^{rs} of
 this my last Will and Testament should see my Estate wasseing in the life time of
 my wife that they shall have it in their power to sell or direct any part of it as they
 may judge to be best in this behalf.

A Court held for Greensville County the 20th day of February 1708 this Will was proved according to Law by the Oaths of John Brett and John Dupree Witnesses thereto and Ordered to be recorded. And on the Motion of Elizabeth Dupree and Michael Warren two of the Executors therein named who made Oath thereto and together with John Morris and his son Morris their Securities entered into and acknowledged their Bond in two thousand Pounds conditional as the Law directs and Certificate was granted them for obtaining a probate thereof and the other Executors refused to join in the said probate.
