Item, I give and bequeath to my son William Tyus the following lands, to wit, all my lands lying in the County of Greenville and Brunswick, also six Negroes, to wit, Jeff, Reddick, Matt, Stephen, Delphia, and Zilpha, also one bed and furniture, also one horse named Buck, one Desk, half a dozen chairs, and my Still to him and his heirs forever.

Item, I give and bequeath to my son in law Isaac Adams, and my daughter Vancy Adams his wife four Negroes, to wit, Brag and Grace his wife, and Violet, and Duck, and their increase to him and his heirs forever.

Item, I give and bequeath to my son in law Green Wynne and Hannah Wynne his wife, five Negroes, to wit, Moll and her three children that they have now in possession, and Mace a Wench in my possession to them and their heirs forever.

Item, I give and bequeath to my son in law John Thomas, and my daughter Frances Thomas his wife four Negroes, to wit, Gabe, Sall, Aleck and Holland, and their increase to them and their heirs forever.

Item, I give and bequeath to my daughter Polly Tyus, one bed and furniture one Mare named Blare, and five Negroes to wit, Noll, Poin

Item, I give and bequeath to my daughter Polly Tyus, one bed and furniture
one Mare named Blare, and five Negroes, to wit, Cee, Nell, Rose,
Curtis, and Viny and their increase to her and her heirs forever.

Item, I give and bequeath to my daughter Amy Tyus, one bed and furni-
ture, also one mare named Diamond also five Negroes to wit, London,
blo, Sharper, Hannah, Louisa, and their increase to her and her
heirs forever.

Item, I give and bequeath to my daughter Rebecca Tyus, one bed and furniture
also one Mare named Pleasant, also five Negroes, to wit, Grace a Negro
Girl I lent Green Wynne. Ned. Limbrick, Ruth, and Belah and
their increase to her and her heirs forever.

Item, I give and bequeath to my son John Tyus, seven Negroes, to wit, Bob,
Wyatt, Fran, and Wilks, and her three children, Speaker, Pallace,
and Cynthia, and their increase to him and his heirs forever.

Item, I give and bequeath to my son Lewis Tyus fifty pounds and the
House he moved from and all the Negroes he carried away with
him that he had of me, and their increase to him and his heirs
forever.

Item, I give and bequeath to my Grandson James Edwards one Negro boy
named

00. I named Bolling, also one horse pleasant's bolt, also one bed and furniture to him and his heirs forever.

Item, I give and bequeath to my Grand son John Fox, one negro named Brad-
lock, also one bolt, to wit, Diamond's to him and his heirs forever.

Item, I give and bequeath to my Grand child Gilliam Fox one Negro boy
named Isham, also one bolt, to wit, Blazes to him and his heirs forever.

Item, I give and bequeath to my Grand child Francis Dancy Tyus one negro
to wit, Wyatt a child of Curties to him and his heirs forever.

Item, My desire is that my flock of all kinds may sold when my crop is
finished, also my crop, and all the rest of my Estate not mentioned
and the money arising from the sales to be converted towards paying
my Just debts, and the fifth pounds I have given my son Lewis
Tyus, and the bed to be bought for James Edwards to be made up out
of the money arising from the ^{said} sales, and the Ballance, to be equally
divided between my three daughters, to wit, Polly Tyus, Amy Tyus,
and Rebekah Tyus. and my desire is that my College land be rented
out, and the money arising from the said land I give to my son
William Tyus.

Item, I leave my son William Tyus and his Estate to the care of my son John
Tyus untill he arrives to the age of twentieth one years old. I desire,

At Greensville County Court September 1794 This Will was proved according to Law by the Oaths of Evans Mabry, Charles Locke, and Lucy Nicholson Witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded, and on the Motion of John Tjus the Executor therein named who made Oath thereto according

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according to Law, and together with Nathaniel Rivers, and Thomas Rivers, his securities entered into and acknowledged their Bonds in the penalty of six thousand pounds conditioned as the Law directs.

Certificate was granted him for obtaining a probate thereof in due form.

And at October Court following the Codicil to the said Will annexed was proved by the oath of Evans & Mabry a Witness thereto and ordered to be recorded,
