Estate except what I hereafter bequeath to her she heirs forever.
Item I give to my grandson Henry Britton one sow to him and his
heirs forever. Item I give to my Grand Daughter Polly Riddle
one cow to her and her heirs. And lastly I do hereby constitute
and appoint my friend Abalom Atkins executor of this my last
Will and Testament hereby revoking all other or former Wills or
Testaments by me heretofore made. In Witness whereof I have here-
unto set my Hand and affixed my seal this Twenty Ninth Day of
November 1799.
