her natural life together with the increase of the said Negroes. Item
I Give and bequeath the above said Negroes and their increase if any
after the Death of my above mentioned Sister Sarah Soushall to all her
Children that may be then living to be equally divided between them and
their heirs for ever. Item I Give and bequeath to my Sister Winny
Clifton my Negroe Girl Sybra to her and her heirs for ever. Item
I Give and bequeath to my Brother John Lundy my Negroe Boy
Will to him and his heirs for ever. Item I Give and bequeath to my

I Give and bequeath the above said Negroes and their increase if any
after the Death of my above mentioned Sister Sarah Southall to all her
Children that may be then living to be equally divided between them and
their heirs for ever. Item I Give and bequeath to my Sister Winney
Clifton my Negroe Girl Sylvia to her and her heirs for ever. Item
I Give and bequeath to my Brother John Lundy my Negroe Boy
Will to him and his heirs for ever. Item I Give and bequeath to my
Uncle James Lundy One Feather Bed and furniture to him and his
heirs for ever. Item I Give ^{and bequeath} to my above said Winney Clifton and Brother
John Lundy all the rest of my Estate both Real and personal after my
just Debts are paid to be equally divided between them and their heirs
for ever. And I do hereby appoint my Uncle William and James
Lunday whole and sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament.

with Henry Tillari his Security entered into and acknowledged their
Bond in the Penalty of One thousand Pounds conditioned as the
Law directs Certificate was granted him for obtaining a Probate
thereof in due form. Liberty being reserved for the other Executor to join
in the said Probate when he may think fit.
