desire is that my two old Servants Anker and Jenny may live where
they chuse and be treated well, my desire also is that my Negro Man
Frank shall be sold but not to go out of this State I give to my
Niece Mary Chapman One Bed and furniture and one cow and
half, and the remainder of my stock I give to my Son Nathaniel
Wyche I also give to my said Niece Ten Pounds to be paid to her

51A) out of the Money arising from the sale of my ^{said} Negro Man Frank I likewise give to my Daughters Rebecca Fletcher Martha Stokes and Lanny Goodwyn Eliza Putney and Mary Anne Chapman Goodwyn to each of them a mourning suit My will and desire is that all the residue and remainder of my Estate of what nature or kind so ever shall be equally divided amongst all my Daughters & Mary's Putney's Children in witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand
