In the Name of God Amen, I Mary Wynne of the Parish of
Saint Andrew and County of Greenville, being sick and weak in Body but
of sound Mind and Memory, blessed be God for the same, and calling to
Mind the Mortality of Life, and the certainty of Death. Do make and
ordain this my Last Will and Testament in manner and form following;
I do recommend my Soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it me
and my Body to the Earth, to be buried in a decent Christian like manner,
nothing doubting but to receive the same again at the general resurrection
of the dead by the power of Almighty God through the Merits of my Redeemer
Jesus Christ, And as to what worldly Estate it hath pleased God to bestow
upon me, I dispose of the same as followeth. It is my Will and desire that
the ^{Land} plantation whereon I now live be equally divided as soon as may be
after my decease, by three good Men to be chosen by my Executors here-
in after mentioned, And that immediately after such division one
Moiety thereof shall be the property of my Son Robert Powell, which I
do hereby give and bequeath unto my said Son Robert and to his Heirs &c
forever. And the other Moiety of my said Land I do desire may
be the property of my Grandson William Powell, Son of Edward Powell
Deceased.

(28) Deceased, which said Land should my said Grand Son William arrive
to the Age of Twenty One Years or Marriage. Then give to my said Grand
Son and to his Heirs and Assigns for ever. But if my said Grand Son shall
die before he arrives to Age or Marriage as aforesaid, Then I give the
whole of my said Land unto my said Son Robert Powell and to his Heirs
and Assigns forever. Item I give and bequeath unto my Grand Dau-
ghter Mary Lee Wife of James Lee, One Feather Bed and Furniture and
stands in my large Room, my Cloak and all the best of my wearing
apparel, One flat pewter Dish, One deep pewter dish, One dutch Oven,
One Bay Horse call'd Doctor, My Tea pot, cups and saucers, and one
small round Table. Item I give and bequeath unto my Grand Son Isaac
Collier Son of Thomas Collier, One guinea in Cash and three Barrels of
Corn. Item I give and bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Tabitha Fuelle
Powell, Daughter of Edward Powell deceased upon her arriving to the
Age of twenty One Years or Marriage the sum of Twenty Pounds Cash.
Item I give and bequeath unto my Grand Son Thomas Collier, Son of Thomas Collier, One Guinea in Cash & three Barrels of Corn.
Item I give and bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Mary Powell daug-
hter of Robert Powell One guinea in Cash. Item I give and bequeath unto
my Son John Powell the Bed and furniture, with stands whereon I
usually lie, and all my table and Stone ware, except what I have
already given away. Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Robert
Powell

Powell all my fixtures except that I have already given away, My Riding
Chair and Harness my Arm and Chair in which I usually sit, and One
large folding Table. Item. I give and bequeath unto my Sons John

Negroes, Man, Jane, Harry, Dick, and little Harry and their increase.
They my said Sons always saving harmless my Estate and indemnified
from all costs, and damages which may come against it by means
of their detaining the said Negroes, and likewise paying all and every
claim that may come against me or my Estate on Account of the said
Negroes. Item. My Will and desire is that my Negro Man Anthony
have the liberty of choosing a Master from Year to Year ^{for} two Years
after my decease to whom he may be hired, for the best price that can
be got, and that the Money arising from the said Hire for the first
Year I give to my Son John Powell, and for the second Year to my Son
Robert Powell. And at the expiration of the said ^{two} Years I do hereby
Emancipate my said Negro Man Anthony, and if any thing further
be necessary for effecting the said Emancipation. I do hereby give to
my Executors full power to execute the same. Item. My Will further
