Harrison of Greensville County being in a low State of Health but
of a sound State of Mind, thanks be to God, do make and Ordain this my
last Will and Testament, hereby Revoking all other Wills by me heretofore
made. **IN WITNESSE** I desire that my Body may be decently buried as
the discretion of my Executors hereafter mentioned and that my just
Debts be paid and for the rest of my Estate, I give and dispose of in
manner following, to wit, I Give to my Son Miles Harrison the Land
and Plantation whereon I now live, containing Sixty Acres more or
less also two Negroe Girls by the Names of Jenny and Lucy to him, his
heirs and Assigns for ever. **Item**, I lend to my beloved Wife, Dolly
my Negroe Wench Fanny during her natural Life also the use of my
personal Estate, to pay my Debts, and raise and School my Son Miles
Hubbard and William Harrison and after her Death I Will that
the above Negroe Wench and her increase with the rest of the personal
Estate be equally divided between my three Sons above mentioned.

Item, I Give to Petsy Harrison five Shillings I nominate &
appoint Nath Peterson and my Brother Richard Harrison
Executors of this my last Will and Testament.

1794, 1795, 1796. Negroe Girls in the Names of my and Lucy to sum his
house and I sign for ever. I W M. I send to my beloved Wife Dolly
my Negroe Wench Fanny during her natural Life also the use of my
personal Estate to pay my Debts and raise and School my Son Miles
Hubbard and William Harrison and after her Death I Will that
the above Negroe Wench and her increase with the rest of the personal
Estate be equally divided between my three Sons above mentioned.

I W M. I Give to Betsy Harrison five Shillings. I nominate &
appoint Bate Peterson and my Brother Richard Harrison
Executors of this my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and put my Seal this Seventeenth
Day of February 1792

granted him for obtaining a Probate thereof in due form And Bart
Peterson the other Executor therein named personally refused to join
in the said Probate.
