in the manner and form following. Item I give and bequeath to my three

Tract of Land and Plantation containing four hundred Acres more or less
to be equally divided between them as my Executors to them and their heirs for
ever. Item I give and bequeath to my Son Joel Laughan five hundred
Pounds current Money in Lieu of Land to him and his heirs for ever.
Item I give and bequeath to my Son Joshua Laughan five hundred Pounds
current Money in Lieu of Land to him and his heirs for ever. Item I give
to my beloved Wife Martha Laughan one third part of my Estate both real and
personal after my two Youngest Sons have been out and at my Orders
Death to be equally divided among all my Children. Item I give and bequeath

Wish to be equally divided among all my children. Wm. Price and servant.
to my eight children namely William Vaughan, Levice Vaughan, Micalla
Vaughan, Thomas Vaughan, Rebecca Vaughan, Isaac Vaughan, Ed-
Vaughan, and Joshua Vaughan. All the Residue and residue of my
Estate that I have not before mentioned to be equally divided among them
and their heirs for ever. I therefore leave that then my whole and undivided
of my Estate. I do hereby appoint my little daughter Vaughan and my
son William Vaughan Executors of this my last Will and Testament.
