and Testament, first I recommend my soul to the Almighty God that gave it me and my
body to be buried in a decent Christian manner at the discretion of my Executors; And as to
such worldly goods as has been pleased God to bless me with in this life I devise in
the following manner To wit, Item I give and bequeath to my Son Went Mapes all my
Land whereon I now live and one negro man named Ephraim to him and his heirs forever
more— Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Rebekah Moody one negro Woman named
Lucy and her increase since she has had her in possession to her and her heirs forever more.
Item I give unto my Daughter Elizabeth Grayford one negro man named Sam which
negro she has now in possession to her and her heirs forever more. Item I give unto my Son
William Mapes one negro man named Peter which negro he has now in ^{his} possession to
him and his heirs forever more— Item I give unto my Daughter Polly Mapes one negro
Woman named Aggy, and her child by the name of Washington and her child by the
name of Emily, and their increase, and in case she should die and leave no other child
it is my will and desire after her death, her Daughter Peggy Caps Mapes should
have the negroes before named and their increase to her and her heirs forever. I also give
my Daughter Polly Mapes Twenty five pounds Virginia Money, to her and her heirs
forever more— Item I deposit unto my Son Went Mapes's hands the following negroes
namely, a Woman known by the name of Hepsy Jany and her child by name of Eluck

name of Emmy, and their increase, and in case she should die and leave no other child
it is my will and desire after her death, her Daughter Peggy Capps Mafey should
have the Negroes before named and their increase to her and her heirs forever. I also give
my Daughter Polly Mafey Twenty five pounds Virginian Money, to her and her heirs
forever more - I deposit unto my Son Arent Mafey's hands the following Negroes
namely, a Woman known by the name of Hagar Janny and her child by name of Eluck
and their future increase for the following purpose, that is, Arent Mafey shall at his own
discretion furnish to Angelicals Butler the Negroes or the profits arising from them annually
for the support of her and her Children as he may Judge is best and after her the said

27 Angelilah Battle death It is my Will and desire the negro Jimmy and all her increase shall be equally divided between all the Children of my daughter Angelilah, and should my daughter aforesaid die leaving no ^{child or} living Children the Negroes aforesaid shall fall into my Estate and be equally divided. Item It is my will and desire that after my death, that all my Estate not heretofore given away should be sold and pay all my just debts and the balance to be divided between all my Children namely, Aunt Mapey, Rebecca Moody, Elizabeth Grizzard, William Mapey, Polly Mapey, Sally Edwards and Angelilah Battle and my will is that the part of Angelilah Battle shall immediately fall into the hands of my Son Arent Mapey for the benefit of my daughter Angelilah and her Children to be furnished at his my Sons own discretion to them as he may think proper or best, and that my Son has full power to purchase any thing that he may Judge is advantageous for my daughter Angelilah and her Children out of any money that he shall have in his hands for their benefit, just obtaining the consent of my daughter Angelilah to any thing that may be purchased. Lastly I do appoint my Son Arent Mapey, and John Arent Junr. my Executors to this my last will and Testament, and do hereby disannul, and revoke all other wills by me heretofore made. In witness my hand and seal this sixteenth day of September one thousand eight hundred and Thirteen.
