him for obtaining letters of administration with the Will annexed in due
form according to Law.

from the date hereof to him and his heirs forever.

Item, I give and bequeath to my Son John Mafey the remainder part of the Tract of
Land whereon I now live after the death of my wife Martha Mafey to him
and his heirs forever.

Item, I give and bequeath to my daughter Sally Mafey one feather bed and furni-
ture also one side Saddle and bridle when she shall arrive to the age of twenty
one Years or is married to her and her heirs forever.

Item, I leave all the rest of my Estate of what nature or kind soever, not already
disposed of to my loving Wife ^{Martha Mafey} during her natural life if
she continues my widow but in case she should marry, my will and desire
