This Will was proved according to Law by the Oath of the Witnesses
thereto and Ordered to be recorded And on the Motion of the Executors
therein named who made Oath thereto and together with James
Mason and Douglass Withins their Securities entered into
and acknowledged their Bond in the Penalty of three thousand
Pounds conditioned as the Law directs Certificate was granted
(Ex. 8) them for obtaining a Probate thereof in due form.
