At the writing of this ^{Booksville Court House Hills, Book 2, 1860 to 1865}
I, Robert Spencer of Greenville
county being weak of body, but in perfect mind and memory (thank
to God for the same) and calling to mind the mortality of the body do
make and ordain this my last will and Testament in manner as follows:

I promise, I give and bequeath unto my
loving wife Mary Spencer one Negro boy named Harry to her
and her heirs forever if lord my said wife the land and plantation
whereon I now live the house to be and kitchen furniture
plantation utensils & together with the following Negroes namely

old Cato, Hannah, Betty, Phyllis and Sarah, the present bondsmen
every kind and one third of my cattle, Sheep and Hogs, one brown
Mare, one black colt, and a Horse called Tom Rolling during her
natural life or widowhood also one Riding Chair.

Item, I give and bequeath to my son Thomas Spencer the land
and plantation whereon he now lives (deeded by me to him) and
the following Negroes namely Jefee, Edmund, Shubert, Aggy, and
her increase since in his possession to him and his heirs forever.

Item, I give and bequeath to my son Robert Spencer the land

Item I give and bequeath to my son Thomas Spencer Madand
and Plantation whereon he now lives (deeded by me to him) and
the following Negroes namely Jefie, Edmund, Shubert, Aggy and
her increase since in his possession to him and his heirs forever.

Item, I give and bequeath to my son Robert Spencer Madand
and Plantation whereon he now lives (deeded by me to him) and
the following Negroes namely Joe, Biny, Grace, and their
increase since in his possession and deactory five pounds es-
cument Money of Virginia to him and his Heirs forever.

Item, I give and bequeath to my son Ellish Spencer Madand
and Plantation whereon he now lives containing three hundred
and twenty eight (38) acres to the same minor left and the
following Negroes namely Baring, Adam, Cyrus, Mary and her
increase since in his possession to him and his heirs forever

Item, I give and bequeath to my Daughter Nancy Flavelle the
following Negroes namely Joe, Tarry, Sally, Judah, and their
increase

income which in her profession of teaching provides her most Money of
Virginia to her and her heirs forever.

I am, I give and bequeath to my daughter Barbara Spencer Head and
Plantation called his, containing three hundred and thirteen acres of
Acres he the same more or less, and the following Negroes namely
Tom, Anthony, Ben, and Lucy to him and his heirs forever.

I am, I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Martin the
following Negroes, to wit; Maria and her Child Alfred, Grace,
and Billy to her and her heirs forever.

I am, I give and bequeath to my Daughter Barbara Spencer Head
the following Negroes to wit Lucy and her two Children Judith and
Sammy, and Peter to her and her heirs forever.

I am, I give and bequeath unto Nancy Perry and her Sister Polly
Taylor a Negro Woman named Harry and her three Children
to wit Lucy, Rizzy and Billy to be equally divided to them and
their heirs forever.

I am, I give and bequeath unto John Perry a Negro Boy
named Joe to him and his heirs forever.

I am, I give and bequeath unto James Perry a Negro Boy

named before to him and his heirs forever.

Item, I give and bequeath unto Lucy Perry a Negro Woman
named Lydia to her and her heirs forever.

Item, I give and bequeath the rest and residue of my Estate both,
real and personal not already devised, after paying my just
debts, reserving to each of my Daughters one hundred pounds,
to be equally divided among all my children to them and
their heirs forever, and lastly I appoint my son Thomas
Spencer and my friend Williamson Bonner as Executors to
this my last will and testament; making void all former
wills by me made. In witness whereof I do hereby set my
hand and affix my seal, this sixth day of October A.D.
One Thousand eight hundred and six.

In the name of God, Amen. I Charles Heathcock of Green-
ville County being weak and low in health but of sound mind &
Memory knowing it is once appointed for all men to die do make
and ordain this my last will and Testament revoking all other
Wills heretofore made by me and touching my post Mortal Estate
wherewith it hath pleased God to leave me under capose
of the same in the following manner.

Item I leave to my wife Frances Heathcock during her
natural life or widowhood the land whereon I now live with
four Negroes namely Solah Wiley, Pol, and Jerry also one
More, also one Negro boy by name of Dick until my son
