

In the name of God Amen I Robert Williamson of the County of
Greensville and state of Virginia make this my last will and Testament
I resign my soul to its Creator in humble hopes of its future happiness in
the disposal of a being infinitely good, as to my body I desire it may be
buried in a decent manner, and what estate it hath, pleased God to
bless me with, I dispose of it in the following manner. First I lend
to my loving wife Martha Williamson during her natural life all my
Land whereon I now live, also four Negroes following Anthony, Mason,
Peter, and Chloe, also I lend her choice of the following Articles One
Horse, two Cows and Calves, Two Sows and Pigs, Six Sheep, Two
Beds and furniture, and as much household furniture as is
necessary without waste, as much provision as will make her
support until the next crop. Secondly, I give and bequeath to my
son Beverly Williamson two Negroes namely Simon & Violet to him
his heirs and assigns forever. Thirdly I give to my son Ludy
Williamson, Dick and Rose to him his heirs and assigns forever.
Fourthly I give and bequeath to my son Rowland Williamson
Two Negroes namely, at the death of my wife, Anthony & Mason,
with

Alb. with One Hundred pounds Cash at my death to him and his heirs and assigns forever, I desire that my son Beverly to manage for him and see that it is not wasted. Fifthly, I give and bequeath to my son Edmund Williamson Peter at the decease of my wife, with part at my death to him his heirs and assigns forever. Sixthly I give and bequeath to my grand daughter Nancy Adams one Negro Girl named Chloe when the aforesaid Nancy Adams shall arrive to the age of Eighteen to her, her heirs and assigns forever. Seventhly I give and bequeath to my grand daughter Mary Pyles Adams Two Negroes namely John and Pips when the aforesaid Mary P. Adams shall come to the age of Eighteen to her her heirs and assigns forever. If either of the aforesaid grand daughters should die without a lawful heir the living one shall heir her portion, and if both should die without a lawful heir their Estates shall be equally divided between my Children. Eighthly I desire at the death of my wife that what I have left her that is not given away above may be sold with every other thing that is not mentioned, and that it may be sold and equally divided between my Children. Lastly I do hereby appoint my wife Martha Williamson, my son Beverly, Williamson, and Edmund Williamson Executors of this my last will and testament.
