

In the name of God Amen. I the County of Greensville, Virginia Wills, Book 2, 1808 to 1816
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and ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form following. I leave unto
my Daughter Sarah Hamwell wife of Peyton Hamwell one Negro boy to be one Negro woman Dinah
and her increase, one feather Bed, 40 minutes, Eight head of Cattle, all my Earthen ware and
kitchen furniture and the proceeds of the Sale of my Crop and Stock except such of the Stock
hereafter given away and eight head of sheep, the aforesaid property to be enjoyed by my said
Daughter during her natural life and at her death I give the said Negro boy Rob to my grand
Daughter Frances Hamwell and the said Negro Dinah and other property to be equally divided
among all her living Children at her death - and in case of the death of my said grand daughter
Frances Hamwell if that should happen before she arrives to a lawful age or married I give the
said boy Rob to be equally divided as before divided among the brothers & sisters of said Frances
to them and their heirs forever. Item I give unto my Daughter Mary Batte three Negroes to
wit Jack, Faby and Jim and the increase two cows and calves and three head of sheep, but my
said daughter is to suffer my servant David to have the use of one of the cows during his life
to her and her heirs forever. Item I leave unto my Daughter Elizabeth Parkman one Negro
Woman Lily and her increase one bed and furniture & three sheep on my plantation in
prince George & two cows and calves, and after her death I give the said property to be equally
divided among her living Children to them and their heirs forever. Item I give to my son
Alexander W. Batte my large Copper Kettle. Item I leave in the hands of my Daughter Mary

kitchen furniture and the proceeds of the sale of the said land and stock except such of the stock
hereafter given away and eight head of sheep, the aforesaid property to be enjoyed by my said
Daughter during her natural life and at her death I give the said Negro boy Bob to my grand
Daughter Frances Howell and the said Negro Dynah and other property to be equally divided
among all her living children at her death and in case of the death of my said grand daughter
Frances Howell if that should happen before she arrives to a full age or married I give the
said boy Bob to be equally divided as before decided among the brothers & sisters of said Frances
to them and their heirs forever. Item I give unto my Daughter Mary Batte three Negroes to
wit Jack, Toby and Jim and the increase two cows and calves and three head of sheep but my
said daughter is suffer my servant David to have the use of one of the cows during his life
to her and her heirs forever. Item I land unto my Daughter Elizabeth Parkman one Negro
Woman Sally and her increase one bed and furniture three sheep on my plantation in
said George three cows and calves, and after her death I give the said property to be equally
divided among her living children to them and their heirs forever. Item I give to my son
Alexander W Batte my large Copper kettle Item I leave in the hands of my Daughter Mary
Batte one feather Bed and furniture for the use of my life and Daughter ^{Betsy} Tucker and at
her death to be sold and the proceeds divided among her living children. Item I give to my
Grand Daughter Mary Goodrich one cow called Rivers's Cow three head of sheep twenty pounds

 Negro each paying her Ten Pounds to her and her heirs forever. I nominate Mary Bate Executor
