ordain this my last will and Testament and first I bequeath my Soul to

it into the realms of bliss above, and my Body to its mother Earth, to be decently
buried, and as to my worldly goods which God of his mercy hath been pleased to
bless me with I dispose of in manner and form following, Viz. I give and bequeath to my loving Son Thomas Malone one Cow to him his heirs and
assigns forever. I give and bequeath to my loving Daughter Elizabeth the sum
of forty Shillings to her and her heirs forever. I give and bequeath to my loving
Daughter Sarah Malone my Trundle bedstead and the bed and belonging to
it, to her and her heirs forever. I give all the rest and residue of my Estate of
any kind I desire may be sold on twelve months credit and the money
arising from such sale to be equally divided between my two loving Daughters

116) Frances Powell and Palsey Powell, but in case of the Deaths of either of
them before they arrive to Lawful age, or leave Lawful Issue for the Survivor
to have the whole of the said Estate, and in case of both their Deaths before they
arrive to Lawful age, or leave Lawful Issue then my will and desire is that all
the Estate given them be equally divided among my three Children above men-
tioned viz Thomas Malone, Elizabeth Mycke, and Sarah Malone, or the Lawful
Issue of their living Sons and Daughters I do nominate and appoint my loving
Son Thomas Malone my son in Law William Mycke, and my neighbour and
friend Frederick Hobbs Executors to this my last Will and Testament, hereby
making void and void all former Wills and bequests lawfully made
and confirming this and no other to be my last Will and Testament, In witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seal, this Eighteenth day
of July A.D. 1804.
