One Hog head of Cotton One Large Chest to him and his heirs for ever.  
I Give and bequeath to my Son Edmund Lucas One Negroe Woman  
Agga her and her future increase the Sitt and all my Stock of  
Cattle One feather Bed and furniture the Cart Wheels Ten Hogs his  
choice the remainder of my Peewee which I have not given away with  
all my Kitchen furniture the Horse called Dolphim and the Grey Cows  
also a sufficiency of Corn to serve him and his family till the new  
Crop comes in One Gallon One Pint, and One Gile Pot all my Coopers  
and Plantation Tools Five Pigs and all my Cyder basks all my  
Chairs, Tables One Cupboard and Desk two Chests and all the remainder  
of my Cotton One Spining Wheel One pair of Cotton Cards the best.  
One pair Flat Irons and One pair of Tongs to him and his heirs for  
ever. My Will and desire further is that my Bacon be equally  
divided between my two Sons. Nathaniel Lucas 2 1

and one piece of land goes to him and his heirs for  
ever. My Will and desire further is that my Bacon be equally  
divided between my two sons, Nathaniel Lucas and Edmund Lucas  
them and their heirs forever. I give my stock of Sheep to be equally  
divided between my three sons to wit, Frederick Lucas, Nathaniel  
Lucas and Edmund Lucas to them and their heirs forever. Further  
I have ~~any~~ thing which I have not given away to be sold and the money  
arising from the sales to go in discharge of the Debts due from my  
Husbands Estate. And it is my further Will that there be no  
Inventory taken of my Estate neither that it should be appraised  
and it is my further Wish that my Executors give neither Bond nor  
Security for their faithful performance. I do hereby appoint  
my son, Nathaniel Lucas and my cousin John Lucas Executors of  
this my last Will and Testament, Given under my hand and Seal this  
Second day of March One thousand seven hundred and Eighty three

An INVENTORY of the Estate of William Pethes Deceased  
Dated February the 25, 1785.

Seventeen Negroes namely, Peter, James, George, Lucy, Lydia, Sylvia,  
also Arney, Esther, Aaron, Abraham, Agga, Little Peter, Ned, Holland,  
Dick, Miller, 4 Head of Horses, 21 Head of Cattle they say there is Hogs  
ten Sows forty two Pigs, four Barrows in all as they say fifty six Head,  
two Beds and furniture, 4 Bedsteads, and 5 boards, 4 Chests, 4 Ladders,  
three Bird Bells, 3 Scurringles, 6 Head of Sheep, 26 Geese, 1 parcel  
of Chickens and 7 Ducks. 1<sup>st</sup> Steel yard, 2 Hand Saws, 2 Augers,  
1 Chisel, 1 Gouge, 2 Looms, 3 Spinning Wheels, 2 Spindles, 6 Cyder basks,  
4 Barrels and 4 Washing Tubs, 3 Water Pails, 3 Piggins, 1 Churn, 4  
Coke, 2 Skillets, 2 Frying Pans, and the Crop of Corn and Tobacco. Cotton  
Potatoes, Peas, Beans, 1<sup>st</sup> of Traces, 3 Horse Cotton, 2<sup>nd</sup> of Horses,  
7 Baskets, 4 Pegs, 2 Hags, 1 Tumbler, 1 Box Iron and The rest
