acknowledge this to be my last Will and Testament disannulling all
other Wills before written and as it is appointed for all men once to die
and after ^{to God} death judgment in the first place I give my soul that
gave it me and my body to be buried in a decent manner and all my
just debts to be paid and the remainder of any estate both real and
personal I give as follows, I give and bequeath to my loving
 Wife Greasy Stewart her natural life in all my Lands including my
 Mother's life in it as a home if she chooses to live with my Wife and
 the plantation whereon I now live if she so please to continue by
 paying the rent for two years, I give to my Wife for ever my small
 Bay Mare four first choice of my stock of Cattle two Steers, four
 Goats, Twenty Bushels Wheat, fifteen hundred wt. Salt Pork,
 one feather bed and furniture, three Plough hoes, three axes,
 three weeding hoes, forty barrels of Corn to be taken after Christ
 mas, one Stack of Oats, fifteen Shooks, one Sow, four first choice

gravel and my body to be buried in a decent manner and a
just debt to be paid and the remainder of my estate both real and
personal I give as follows. I give and bequeath to my loving
daughter Mary Stewart her natural life in all my Lands including in
all others life in it as a homestead she chooses to live with my Wife on
the plantation whereon I now live if she so pleases to continue by
paying the rent for two years, I give to my Wife forever my small
Bay Mare four first choice of my stock of Cattle two Steers, four
grays, Twenty Bushels Wheat, fifteen hundred wt. Nett Pork,
one feather bed and furniture, three Plough hoes, three axes,
three weeding hoes, forty barrels of Corn to be taken after Christ-
mas, one Stack of Oats, fifteen Shooks, one Sow, six first choice
of my stock of Sheep, all my Cotton and Flax, and Twenty
Pounds Cash, four Bushels Salt, My Will is to lend my Wife
as follows, untill my son Henry Stewart comes to the age of
twenty one years, One gray Horse my other Bay Mare for the
time of two years, and then to my Estate, sold and
divided

divided, I now mention what my Will is of lending my Wife
part of my Estate untill my son Henry comes of age as follows.
my Cart Wheels all my spinning, Wheels and Cards, Loom, and
three feather Beds and furniture, all my stots, Dutch Buss,
I lend ^{also} two Negroes to wit, Solomon and Anahy to continue
with my wife six years to be treated well and at the expiration
of the six years my Will is their Liberty forever, them and their
heirs without any restraint by Slavery to enslave them again.
The part of my Estate given and lent to my Wife is to maintain
my Children in their schooling, she is to draw from my Estate
not yet mentioned, also my Wife is to draw from the said Estate
five pounds a year to maintain my mother as long as she
live with her. Item, I give and bequeath unto, Ann, four
score ten Pounds in Cash. Item, I give and bequeath to my
son Henry & Paton Stewart all my Land to be equally divided
with them after their Mothers Death, if either should die without
heir, it is to return to the living of them, his heirs forever, if
neither died to them and their heirs forever, and if they both die

neither dies to them and their heirs forever, and if they both die
without heir to be equally divided among my living children to
them and their heirs forever, I further desire that all my things
should be settled from one year to another. And my
Will and desire is that the residue of my stock and all my estate
that is not given or lent above, I leave to be paid the money arising
therefrom, including all moneys by me made on bonds, accounts,
and just demands to be equally divided among my five children
Rebecca, Henry, Sally, Jason, and Vanev Stewart to them and
their heirs forever, if either should die without heir to return to
those that are living or their heirs, and all my estate before lent
I leave to be equally divided as I just above mentioned at the
arrival of son Henrys twenty one years, My desire is that James
Batto, ^{Wm} Batto, and Grace Stewart for my Executors, Witness
my hand this fourteenth Day of October 1790.

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At a Court held for Greensville County the 24 day Feby 1794
 This Will was proved according to Law by the Oaths of Willie
 Clarke, and Richmond Sheeling, witnesses thereto and ordered to
 be recorded, And on the Motion of James Batte one of the Executors
 therein named who made Oath thereto according to Law and
 with William Batte, and Peyton Harwell his securities entered
 into and acknowledged their Bond in Penalty of one thou
 sand pounds conditioned as the Law directs, Certificate was
 granted him for obtaining a Probate thereof in due form
 And the other Executors refused to join in the last part of the
