 Real and Personal until my Son Thomas Arrives at the Age of
 twenty One Years upon condition that she provides for my Children
 all necessaries and also causes them to be educated agreeable to their
 Estate and on this express condition that she be under the controul of
 my Executors hereafter named in all things that have a tendency
 to the good and advantage of my Children and Estate but in case
 my said Wife should not conduct herself to the advantage of my
 Children then and in that case my Will is that my Executors do
 instantly make a division of my Estate in manner following
 That is to say I lend to my said Wife during her life One third part
 of my Tract of Land whereon I now live which I suppose will
 include all my Houses and the greatest part of my Plantations
 Beginning at the main Run of the Creek at the Ford thence a
 North course to my back line near the Road including the lower
 part of my Land. Item I

Children then and in that case my Will is that my Executors do
instantly make a division of my Estate in manner following
That is to say I lend to my said Wife during her life One third part
of my Tract of Land whereon I now live which I suppose will
include all my Houses and the greatest part of my Plantation
Beginning at the main Run of the Creek at the Ford thence a
North course to my back line near the Road including the lower
part of my Land. Item I give to my Son Thomas Person the lower
half of my Tract of Land whereon I now live to him and his heirs for ever
upon condition that he permits his Mother to live thereon during her
life as above mentioned Item I give to my Son Henry Person the
upper half of my said Tract of Land to him and his heirs for ever
to be divided from the main Run of the Creek Northward to the back
line Item I give to my Son William Delony Person all my Tract
of Land lying on the South side of Fountain's Creek adjoining the
Country line to him and his heirs for ever. Item I give to my Son
Benjamin Person all my Tract of Land on Island Creek in
Granville County in the State of North Carolina and it is my
Will and desire that if any of my Children die under Age and

not married that his hers or their Estates so dying shall be equally
divided amongst my surviving Children or their heirs. Whosoever my
Estate is divided I lend to my loving Wife Mary all my Household Goods
and Plantation Utensils All my Stock of Horses, Cattle, Sheep and
Hogs except three or four of my best Horses or Mares, which I desire my
Executors hereafter named to dispose of and the Money thence arising
to apply towards defraying the expence of my Childrens Education or other
uses if necessary I also lend to my said Wife during her natural life the
use of one third part of my Negroes and at her Death my Will and desire
is that the said Negroes Household Goods, and Stock of Horses, Cattle,
Sheep and Hogs, and Plantation Utensils to her lent, be equally divided
between my Children then alive and the heirs such of them as may be dead
And whereas the Tract of Land in North Carolina that I have by this my
Will given to my Son Benjamin Person the Title of which I am inform'd
some person proposes to dispute, should my Son by that means be
deprived of the said Land, then in Lieu of it I give him two Young Negroes
such as my Executors shall think just, After which it is my Will and
desire that all the rest of my Negroes not before mentioned be equally
divided between all my Children whenever my Estate may be divided

divided between all my children whenever my Estate may be divided
either by my direction or my Executors. And I do hereby constitute
and appoint James Wall and Henry Delong Executors of this my
last Will and Testament and I do hereby Utterly revoke, disannul
all former bequests, Wills, and legacies by me heretofore in any wise
made, declaring, ratifying and confirming this and no other to be
