feather Bed and furniture and one lace lace chest when she arrives  
to the age of eighteen years or marries to her for her and assigns forever  
in case one of my children should die without an heir  
it my Will the other should his Heirs for her I give also bequeath  
unto my beloved wife Lucy Allen all the residue of my household and  
furniture also one Black mare also I lend her all the residue of  
my estate both real and personal so long as she remains my Heir  
and desire is that in case both my children should die before her arrival  
to the age of eighteen or more in that case to return to me which I have made

of legatee or money in that case to come to my wife before care  
any wife should die before I had time to make my will and if my  
and Nancy Allen my Niece in equal division. Let the remainder and after my  
my wife dies I do give and bequeath all my余地 to my Brothers and Sister  
my last Will and Testament these with small residue situated in my  
Wife dies or sooner before no officier arrives to the age of eighteen or more
