Greensville, Virginia Wills 1781 to 1806
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In the name of God. Amen. I Winnefred Mabry of Greensville County
being Weak in Body but in perfect mind and memory (thanks to Almighty God
for the same) do make and publish this to be my last Will and Testament in
manner and form following. Item I give and bequeath to my Grand
Daughter Martha Lloyd one Cow and calf to her and heirs forever.
Item I give and bequeath to my Grandson Lewis Mabry one Bed and
furniture to him and his heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath to my
Grand Daughter Winnefred Matthews Holt one Bed (to be kept in care
of my Daughter Elizabeth Bonner till she the said Winnefred M. Holt
comes of age or marries) to her and her heirs forever. Item I give and
bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Bonner all the rest and residue of
my Estate of what kind soever (which is not above disposed of) to her
and her heirs forever. Lastly I do appoint my Son in Law John Bonner
Executor to this my last Will and Testament making void all former Will by
me made (But it is my Will and desire that my Executor should not be
compelled to give security for his Executorship; and that my Estate be not
appraised ~~at~~ ^{in witness whereof} I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal
this Second Day of August A.D. 1803.

the County of Greensville, Willie Clark and Lucy Clark who being first
sworn on the Holy Evangelists of Almighty God depose and saith that
William Morris on the Evening he was taken for death called on the said
Clark and wife to take notice that as he had ~~some~~ money of his
wife it was his wish that if he should die before the money was paid
to his wife she should have a horse known by the name of ~~Spring~~
extraordinary. Taken before me this 24th of Jan'y 1804. Michael Wall J. P.
