being sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and sound memory do make and ordain this my
last will and testament nothing at all in this heretofore made by me, Item I give and
bequeath unto my son Thomas Allen one negro man named Mingo now in his possession - Item I
give and bequeath unto my son John Allen four children Henry, Walter, John & Elizabeth one
Negro Man named Jacob to be equally divided among them after the death or marriage of their Mother
Nanny Allen - Item I give and bequeath unto my son Hamlin Allen one Negro man named Ben
now in his possession - Item I lend unto my Daughter Caley Mangum during her life one
Negro Woman named Bot & her children David and Thomas Henry & Peter and after her death
to be equally divided among the lawful begotten heirs of her body - Item I give and bequeath unto
my son Henry Allen all the tract of Land whereon I now live and one Negro man named Samuel
now in his possession - Item I lend unto my Daughter Jane Whitfield one Negro girl named Kachel
during her life and after her death or marriage to be equally divided among the lawful begotten
heirs of her body - Item I lend unto my wife Mary Allen six Negroes Isaac, Luc, Jack, Tab and
Pit and all my stock and household and Kitchen furniture
during her life as a widow and after her death or marriage then Luc, Jack, Tab, Mary, Nanny and
Pit and all the remains of my Estate to be sold and the equally divided among my living
children Thomas, Hamlin & Henry Allen, Mary Shelton, Caley Mangum and Jane Whitfield.

But and all the remains of my Estate to be sold and the money divided among my children Thomas, Hainlin & Henry Allen. (Also Margaret and Jane Whitfield) but I lend unto Mary Shelton her part arising from the sale of the above named property at the death or marriage of my wife Mary Allen during her life then to be equally divided among the lawful begotten heirs of her body. Lastly I appoint and nominate my wife Mary Allen and my son Henry Allen my sole Executors to this my last will and testament, and my will and desire is that there shall not be any sale of my Estate at my Death In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this twenty third day of November in the year of our Lord one Thousand eight hundred and fifteen—

A Court held for Greenville County the 8th day of January 1816. This will was proved according to laws by the oaths of Thomas Dillehay, Warren Webb and Polley W. Walton the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded, and on the motion of Henry Allen the Executor therein named who made oath thereto and together with John D. Maclean and William J. Jeffries his Secutaries entered into and acknowledged their bond on the penalty of

Twenty thousand Dollars, conditioned as the Law directs Certificate is granted him for obtaining a probat of the said Will in due form.
