

In the Name of God Amen, December the Eighth One
Thousand Hundred and Ninety Nine I William Goodrich of Greenville
County being in Tranquility of ^{mind}, do make and ordain this my last Will
and Testament in manner and form following. — I hereby I lend
to my Wife Anne Goodrich all my Estate of what nature or kind soever
(after paying my Just debts) during her natural life or widowhood
provided she keeps and supports my Three Children hereafter mentioned
with her until they or either of them shall Marry, at which time my
said Wife is exempt from keeping the one so married; and immediately
after her death or marriage I will and desire that my Estate be
divided in the following manner. — Item I give and
bequeath to my daughter Dolley Goodrich one Negro boy by name
Austin also one Feather Bed and Furniture to her and her heirs
forever. — Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Lucy
Goodrich one Feather Bed and Furniture to her and her heirs forever.

467) Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Nancy Courtney Goodrich and
feather bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever. — Item my
will and desire is that my negro Man Jacob be equally divided between
my Two Daughters Lucy, and Nancy Courtney Goodrich after the death or
Marriage of my said wife. And lastly I constitute and appoint my wife
Anne Goodrich sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament. In Wit-
ness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and
date above written. William Goodrich (J. S.)
