and Six plates to her and her heirs. Item I give and bequeath unto
my Son Benjamin Peckles One Negroe George and one Horse naming
Harry and one Bed and furniture and One pot and One Churn and
One Frying Pan and two Dishes and Six plates and four head of
cattle to him and his heirs. Item I

I give to God who gave it me and my Body to be buried as Usual, in full and
firm hope that I shall rise again in the Resurrection at the first day and
receive free pardon and remission of sins through the merits and mediation
of Jesus Christ my Saviour and as to what Worldly goods God hath
graciously lent me I give and bequeath in manner and form following

Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Winifred Peables three
Negroes, Esther, Peter and Ned, the Daughter and Sons of Lydia and
One feather Bed and furniture and one Horse and saddle to the Value
of Twelve Pounds and two cows and calves and One Chest two Dishes
and six plates to her and her heirs. Item I give and bequeath unto
my Son Benjamin Peables One Negroe George and One Horse naming
Larry and one Bed and furniture and One pot and One Chest and
One Frying Pan and two Dishes and six plates and four head of
cattle to him and his heirs. Item I give and bequeath unto my Son
George Peables One Negroe also to him and to his heirs. Item I give
and bequeath unto my Daughter Jenny Peables One Negroe girl Amey
to her and to her heirs. Item I give and bequeath unto my Son William
Peables One Negroe boy Naron to him and to his heirs. Item I give and
bequeath unto my Son Nathaniel Peables One Negroe Boy Abram

70 to him and to his heirs. Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter
Frances Pebles One Negroe Girl Agga to her and to her heirs. Item
I give and bequeath unto my Son John Pebles, One Negroe Boy Hollans
to him and to his heirs. Item I lend unto my Loving Wife Ann Pebles
all my Land and the remainder of my Stock and Household goods
and five Negroes, Peter, James, Lucy, Sylvia, Dick, and the Crop and
for her to raise the Children altogether, both black and white during
the time of her being my Widow and afterwards when the Children
comes of Age for all this that is lent to be equally divided among Six
of my Children my Son George Pebles, and my Daughter Jenny Pebles
and my Son William Pebles and my Son Nathaniel Pebles and
my Daughter Frances Pebles, and my Son John Pebles and
Lydia, and Willis and the future increase to be divided among the
same six Children aforementioned, George Pebles, Jenny Pebles,
and William Pebles and Nathaniel Pebles and Frances Pebles and
John Pebles. Item I do have Money enough to build a Dwelling House
Eighteen feet square and the rest of the ready Money to be equally divided
among all my Children after all the just debts is paid. Item I do set
all my Children free at the Age of Eighteen Years Old and my Estate

among all my children after all the just debts is paid. ~~He~~ I do set
all my children free at the Age of Eighteen Years Old. and my Estate
not to be appraised. October the 25. day in the Year One thousand Seven
hundred and Eighty four. And I do appoint Henry Jordan & Henry Wyche &

At a Court held for Greensville County the 23 day of December 1704
This Will was proved according to Law by the Oaths of the Witnesses thereto
and Ordered to be recorded. And at a Court held for the said County the 24th
day of February 1705. On the Motion of William Robinson one of the
Executors therein named who made Oath thereto and together with Thomas
Atackin and William Roent the Securities entered into and acknowledged
their Bond in the Penalty of five thousand Pounds conditioned as the
Law directs Certificate was granted him for obtaining a Probate thereof
in due form Liberty being reserved for the other Executors to join in the
said Probate when they think fit.
