and knowing it is appointed by the wise disposer of all things, that all
Men must die do make and ordain this to be my last Will & Testament
revoking and disannulling all other Wills by me formerly made: My
Soul I give to God who gave it me and to Jesus Christ my blessed
Redeemer: hoping for immortality in the world to come and my body
to the Earth to be decently buried: And as to such worldly Goods it hath
pleased God to bestow on me in this life I give devise and dispose of
the same in manner and form following. Item I lend unto my loving
wife Elizabeth Smith the plantation now in on containing two hundred
Acres more or less, likewise One Negro fellow Named Bull One Negro Wench
Named Lucy One Negro Girl named Phoebe One Bay Mare known by the
Name of Pigeon One Sorrel ^{Gift} ~~Gift~~ her choice of feather Beds and furniture three
Dishes ten plates (to wit) Six pewter ones and four Earthen ones three Cups
three saucers, One coffee pot One Basin, and four knives Forks One Spoon, all
the Stays and Harnesps are on the plantation One Spinning Wheel One
pair of Cotton Cards One pair Wood Cards One Wapper Kettle One Iron pot One
Iron Skillet, four Chains, One Chest, One Bible One side Saddle One
Stryng pan, two Yugs, two Weeding Hoes, two Milling Hoes, One Gaubing hoe,
One plough Hoe, One mattock, two Wedges, One Steel, One Bar, One Pick, One

One plough Hoe, One narrow Wheel hoe, One killing Hoe, One grubbing hoe,
One plough Hoe, One narrow Wheel hoe, One killing Hoe, One grubbing hoe,
Iron and Reapers two Ewes ten head Hogs One third of my Stock Cattle Twenty
Barrels of Corn, Eight bushels of Wheat, the use of my cart wheels, the use of
the Grind Stone, and One bushell of ^{meal} all during her ^{natural} life or Widowhood
and no longer. Item, I give to my Son Peter Smith twenty shillings Sterling
to him and his Heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath to my Son Joel Smith
One Negro fellow James One smooth bore gun, One Chest, One Saddle, One
third of my clothes, and after the death or Marriage of my Wife, Two wedges
One narrow Wheel and One killing Hoe to him and his Heirs forever. Item, I
give and bequeath to my grand Children Sarah Heath and Wyatt Collier after
the Death or Marriage of my Wife, One Negro Wench named Lucy with her
increase to be equally divided between them, to them and their Heirs forever.
Item, I give and bequeath to my Daughter Winifred Mabry, One Negro
Wench named Frances, One Bed and furniture to her and her Heirs forever.
Item, I give to my Daughter Katy Peebles, after the Death or Marriage of my
said Wife, One Negro Girl named Phoebe, and her increase, to her and her Heirs
forever. Item, I give and bequeath to my Daughter Sarah Tatum, One
Negro Girl named Fanny, together with her increase, to her and her Heirs forever.
Item, I give and bequeath to my Son William Smith, Ten pounds, like-
wise, one third of my clothes, to him and his Heirs. Item, I give and bequeath

and no longer Item, I give to my Son Peter Smith twenty shillings Sterling to him and his Heirs for ever. Item, I give and bequeath to my Son Joel Smith

One Negro fellow James One smooth iron gun One chest One saddle One kind of my clothes, and after the death or Marriage of my Wife, Two tridges One narrow Ax, and One killing Hoe to him and his Heirs for ever. Item, I

give and bequeath to my grand Daughter Sarah Heath and Hyatt Collier after the Death or Marriage of my Wife, One Negro Wench named Lucy with her increase to be equally divided between them, to them and their Heirs for ever.

Item, I give and bequeath to my Daughter Winifred Mabry, One Negro Wench named Frances, One Bed and furniture to her and her Heirs for ever.

Item, I give to my Daughter Katy Peebles, after the Death or Marriage of my said Wife, One Negro Girl named Phoebe, and her increase, to her and her Heirs for ever. Item, I give and bequeath to my Daughter Sarah Tatum, One

Negro Girl named Fanny, together with her increase, to her and her Heirs for ever.

Item, I give and bequeath to my Son William Smith, Ten pounds like wise, one third of my clothes, to him and his Heirs. Item, I give and bequeath

to my grand Daughter Rebecca Smith, daughter of Joel Smith, One Negro Girl named Sarah, One feather Bed and furniture, two dishes, three plates, One Spinning Wheel One pair Cotton Cards, One new chest to her and her Heirs for ever.

(126) Item I give and bequeath to my Son David Smith that parcel of Land I
had of John Loftin my Coney ^{Greensville, Virginia Wills 1781 to 1806} ~~Land~~ and the Land I had of Coquis
Mabry supposed to be eleven Acres, One Negro Wench named Fannie One
Negro Girl named Andrew, One Rifle Gun, One Cats Cat Saw, One Tom
saw, all my hoes, pentons and Coopers Tools, One Razor and Razor, One Riding
Saddle and Bridle, One third of my Clothes the use of the Grange Steer, &c. &c.
After the Death or Marriage of my Wife the plantation being then in
like case One Negro fellow named ~~Stall~~ One proper House and Cart
Wheels to him and his Heirs for ever. Item After my just Debts are paid &
Ten pounds raised out of my Estate for my just Debts, all the rest and
residue of my Estate that is not mentioned in this my Will is to be divided
between the following Children to wit David Smith, Joel Smith, William
Smith, Minified Mabry, Haley Peables and Sarah Heath, & Wyatt Collier
to share as One. Likewise after the Death or Marriage of my Wife all
the personal Estate that is left her and not mentioned otherwise in my
Will to be equally divided between the aforesaid Children in like manner.
Item I desire no appraisement be made of my Estate, Item I do hereby
appoint my Wife Elizabeth Smith and my Son David Smith, Executors
of this my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and Seal this Ninth day of October One thousand seven
hundred and eighty two

At a Court held for Greenville County the 21st day of November 5, 1800.

This Will was proved according to Law by the Oaths of the Witnesses thereto and
 ordered to be recorded, And on the Motion of David Smith the Executor therein
 named who made Oath thereto, and together with Edward Pettway, his security
 entered into and acknowledged their Bond, in the Penalty of One thousand pounds
 conditioned as the Law directs, Certificate was granted him for obtaining a
 Probate thereof in due form. The Executrix therein named refused to join in
 the said Probate.
