 when my eldest Son arrives to twenty age to them their heirs and assigns
 forever. Lastly my will and desire is that my Land and other Estate
 not herebefore last-mentioned may be sold to the highest bidder, on
 such Credit as my Executors shall think proper, to pay my debts and
 the Surplus I give to my beloved wife, and further it is my desire that
 my Estate be not Invented nor appraised And I do hereby appoint my
 beloved wife Rindley and my brother Ureah Cooke Executors to this my
 Last Will and Testament.
