In the Name of God Amen. I Benjamin Redman of Halifax

County being weak in body but in perfect mind and Memory thanks be to God for it, do make this my last Will and Testament, and dispose of what it has pleased God to give me in the following manner and form. I will that all my just Debts be first paid, and desire is that my Land may be sold by my Executor, and all my other Effects, and that after my Debts are paid that my wife Mary Redman shall have one third part of the Money that remains, and I give to my son Ephraim Redman the other two thirds, and to be kept in the hands of my Executor or by him put out on Interest till he arrives of age, if he dies before he is of an Age that it may be equally divided between my two Brothers Quana and Sedman I appoint and constitute Cap^t John Lawrie my whole and sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament, and desire that he may have the Power and

his Estate and that he be put to a Trade. I make this my last Will and Testament,
revoking all former Wills whatsoever. In Witness whereunto I have set my hand and seal
