sixty one I Howard Deane of Halifax County being sick and weak of Body and
Suffering mind and being many thanks together being willing to send the matter
of my soul and knowing that it is appointed of all men now to die make
known this my last will and Testament. First I lend to Rebecca Deane my wife
my Plantations with all the land from the second branch upwards as also my
household Goods & Chattels and all my debts due by payment during the time of
her life except one man and Coll which I Judge to be worth Five Pounds
Sterling I give to John Deane my eldest son to him and his heirs forever my
Plantations &c. which I lend to my wife &c. as expressed. I give to Howard Deane
