and Testament in manner and form following.

Item I leave to my loving wife during her widowhood Two Negroe Boys
One male, Sanchez, Scanny and Melly, also two feather Beds and furniture one house
called Lightfoot, one Slave called Sibley and four Trunks. Three iron Pots one
Frying pan, two dishes, Two Pewter Plates, Two Bars of Tin Cans and eight Drap
the One hundred acres of Land, also one dog of the choice of my dogs
Item I give unto my son James after my wife Marriages or deceas the above four
Negroes, one large Iron Pot called Conjur, and the choice of one of my best shirts
Item I give unto my son in law James Smith all my Wearing Cloaths
Item I give all the rest or residue of my Estate of what Nature soon to be sold
and equally divided amongst my children.

Lastly I appoint and nominate my son James Turner and my wife Kippington
Turner Executrix of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all others
In witness whereof I have hereunto put my hand and affixed my
