I Jonas Sikes of the County of Halifax being under sound Disposition in body but of perfect mind and memory therefore be given unto God Willing to resign the mortallity of my Body and knowing that is appointed for all Men once to die do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament.

It is today principally and first of all I give and recommend my Soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it and my Body I recommend to the Earth to be Buried in decent Christian manner at the discretion of my Executors, nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly Estate where with I hath pleased God to bless me in this life I give, devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form. First I bind the whole of my Estate to my beloved wife Elizabeth Sikes during her life in wedlock. Item I give to my oldest daughter Maryann Burkhardt in Hertford Sterling. to her and her Heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Martha Sykes, Sarah Hill Sykes, Jonas Sykes Jr and Sykes Caesar Sykes Elizabeth Burkhardt. S. S. Elizabeth Miller Sikes and Marritte Sikes the piece of Land that I now live on and the following Year I may buy Danny Gabriel and Brueghell and then I cause to be equally divided after the death or Marriage of my wife Elizabeth Sikes to my eight Children mentioned in this clause of my will or to the survivors of them at the time of the Death or Marriage of my wife in Elizabeth Sikes to them and their Heirs. Item I give and bequeath unto my son Thomas Aldridge Sikes the lot of Land in Norfolk County near the great Bridge Commonly known by the name of Sikes Ordinary and the rents due thereon to him and his Heirs. and it is my intention that my son Thomas Aldridge Sikes shall have no other part of my Estate given before to my other eight Children herefore mentioned. I do appoint my wife Elizabeth Sikes and Edward Sikes in just. of Lencumber County to witness to this my last Will and Testament.
