I Edward Parker of Hattisay County make this my last
 Will & Testament in ... manner following viz I leave &
 Bequeath my Wife Merrica Parker the Negro fellow named
 Joe during her life and likewise an Equal part of my Estate
 after the Legacies are paid. I leave & bequeath to my Daughter
 Elizabeth one negro Girl named Mariah & likewise an
 Equal part of my Estate. I leave & bequeath to my Daughter
 Rebecca one negro Girl named Moll & likewise an Equal
 part of the residue of my Estate I leave & Bequeath to my
 son Two Male children Boys named Gull & Harry and likewise
 the Tract of land I bought of John Standen with an Equal
 part of the residue of my Estate. I desire that the
 Tract I bought of John Bates beginning at a Black
 Oak line Tree on Michieps road so running down the Branch
 to a Swamp where a parcel of apple Trees are planted &
 where there is a Timothy patch. Thence down the Branch
 till you come opposite to the line tree on the river bank
 that divided the two Plantations formerly from thence run
 a straight line to my former back line with all Improve-
 ments on my Land to be sold to the highest bidder and the
 money that arises from said sale to apply to the Dis-
 charge of my just & lawfull Debts. I desire the Purch-
 aser of said Land should pay immediately down one
 Hundred & fifty Pounds, part of which sum I desire to
 be paid Mr. Selliston Ayre on Account of an Exp^{ts}
 against Thomas Spragins & me the Remainder to be
 applied to the discharge of my small Debts the balance
 of the money arising from said Land to be applyed to the
 discharging of a Debt a John H^d John Estate. Much
 in Warwick I leave & bequeath to my Brother John Parker
 one tract of land which I purchased from James New-
 Dock on his paying the money now due for said land

I leave and bequeath to my wife my table linen, ^{two} horses
 as soon as my Estate is able to purchase them, likewise my
 Watch & Household Furniture my Horse named Halket and a
 Mare & her Colt named Polly, all my Horses & Mares
 except the work Horses that are requisite to work the
 Plantation / Likewise may be sold & likewise my Stock of
 Cattle / except them that may be wanted for the plantation
 on / may be sold I desire that a Negro Girl named Ophar
 may be sold likewise. I leave and Bequeath a negro
 Boy named Squire to my wife during her Widowhood
 I appoint my wife Executrix Col. Thomas Tabb of Anne
 lia County, Joshua Morris & James Bates Executors
 of this my Will & Testament Given under my hand the
 25th day of May Anno dom 1767 Edw^d Bookher

NB I desire my Estate should not be appraised. Signed in the
 presence of Richd Bookher Parham Bookher James
 Murdock.

At a Court held for Halifax County the 7th day of September 1767
 The foregoing last Will & Testament of Edward Bookher Gent. deceased
 was exhibited into Court, and Monnica Bookher Widow Relict and
 Executrix therein appointed having signified to this Court by a letter
 from under her Hand, that she would not ^{alleviate} ^{discharge} ^{relieve} her the burthen of
 the Execution of the said Will, and James Bates & Joshua Morris two
 of the Executors therein also appointed came into Court and refused also
 to take upon them the same, and the said James Bates... informing
 the Court... that he received a letter from Thomas Tabb Gent.
 the other Executor in the said Will also appointed, intimating that he
 will not prove the same. On the Motion of John Esdale Esquire
 for obtaining Letters of Administration of the said Testator's Estate
 with his said Will annexed, ^{was} granted him, he having first taken
 the Oath by Law prescribed, and with Paul Carrington and Peter
 Johnston Gentlemen his securities entered into Bond for that
 purpose and acknowledged the same. And the said Will being proved
 by the oath of two of the subscribing Witnesses, ^{was} ordered to be Recorded

 to Law & the same being by the Oaths of the several
 witnesses thereto was ordered to be Recorded & Certified
 to Granted to the said Executor for Obtaining a Pro-
 bate thereof in due form, he having with John
 Frederick Mutter & John Price his securities
 entered into & Acknowledged Bond according to Law
 and liberty is reserved for Moses Farley the other
 Executor, join in the said probate when he shall
 think fit.
