Wife in the Name of God Amen, the 8<sup>th</sup> day of October in the  
year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and seventy three in  
the County of Halifax being very sick and weak in body  
but in perfect mind and memory thankfull to god for his merciful calling to  
mind the mortality of thy Body and knowing it is apprehended for all  
men once to die as man and woman die my last Will and Testament  
that

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that is to say principally and first of all - I give recommend my soul to God that gave it and for my body I recollect to the Earth to be buried in a Christian and decent manner at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God and as touching such Money Estate wherewithal it is pleased God to blesse me with in this life - I give devise and dispose in a manner and form following I Emprefit it is my will and I so order that in the first place all my just debts to pay and satisfied.

Item I leave to my well beloved wife Mary Nichols during her Widowhood only, seven Negroes Namely Peter, Dennis, Frank, Patt, Nelly, Hannah and Jenny also my Manor plantation together with five hundred and eighty of Land Contiguous thereto according to a Survey lately made by Robert Wooding together with my Household furniture himselfe &c also my Slave together with my riding Horse Bess together with all Stocks and manacles of all kinds.

Item I have given to my sons William, John, and Septe Nichols and also to my Daughters Lucy Robertson, Betty Daren and Piggy, their inheritance themselves their Hous and afores all the Land Negroes, Cattle Hogs hils pasture and every other thing that I before left them to have only proper use and behoof of them and their Hous as their parts of my Estate.

Item I give and bequeath to my well beloved son Ambrose Nichols to his Hous and afores all that tract or parcel of land joining his Brother Septe, Hardwick, and Peter Hudson Situate on the branches of Clove Creek Containing four hundred and sixty eight Acres more or less according to a Survey made by Robert Wooding it being part of Order of Council also fifty pounds Current money to bewise out of my Estate by my Executors by selling any thing that can be best shaine also every thing that has been delivered him.

Item I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Nancy Nichols and her Hous and afores all the tract or parcel of land Situate on the branches of Difficult and Blackwater Creeks and on both sides of Stewart Jenny Land joining the tress of Agnes Robertson, Thomas Hope and the two houses of my order and John Jones Containing four hundred and six acres according to a Survey made by Robert Wooding it being

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begin part of my orders aforesaid. I also give to my Daughter aforesaid two Negresses namely Nelly and Hannah one horse or Mare two Cows and Calves and one heifer together with one feather bed of Furniture. Item I give and bequeath to my well beloved son Bud Nichols and to his Heirs and assigns all that tract or parcel of land situated on both sides of Blackwater Creek Containing four hundred and fifty Acres more or less with a plantation House according to a Survey made by Col Wodding it being part of my order of Council joining the lines of my Mann plantation; likewise Agnes Robertson her land I have conveyed to her by the Consent of her Mother &c. I also do give to my aforesd Son Bud Nichols two Negresses namely Peter and Catt also two Cows and Calves and one heifer without a Calf one bed and furniture it is my Will that my Son Cane Nichols shall within twelve months after the decease or endowment of Miss Mary Bud or Nichols fifteen pounds as his part of little Neges named Jenny it is also my Will that in Case I shall depart this life before I sell Blackwater Creek that my Executors shall deliver to Bud David Nichols one <sup>thousand</sup> £100 of Job<sup>s</sup> of about 1200 to be divided equal to purchase each a Suit of Cloths.

Item I give and bequeath to Well beloved son David Nichols and to his Heirs and assigns all that tract or parcel of land Contiguous to my mansion House Situate in fork of Blackwater Creek Containing four hundred and eighty Acres more or less according to a Survey made by Col Robert Wooding it being part of my Order of Council aforesd also three Negresses Namely Lass, Frank and Jenny also two Cows and Calves and one heifer without a Calf also one bed and furniture.

Item I give and bequeath to my two sons Bud and David Nichols and my Daughter Nanny to each of them two cows.

Item I do likewise give to my two sons Bud and David aforesd my Slave Cain and free to be used between them and each to have a like property in him also the two girls the largest to Bud.

Item I give likewise to my Daughter Nanny and my two Sons Bud and David Nichols to each two dishes one bacon and one plate and two knives and forks also it is my Will and desire that all the aforesd

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Legacies is to be made to Nancy, Bird, and Davis Nichols at the executors  
or intermarrying of my wife aforesaid.

I do give to my late beloved son John Nichols all my Wearing Cloths of  
my kind and it my will that the remainder of my Stock household  
furniture and every other thing that can be spared of the plantation  
shall be sold after the executors or intermarrying of my aforesaid wife at six  
months Credit by my Executors and if any of my Children should die  
without issue their Estate be equally divided among the Survivors.  
Item I hereby appoint and constitute Mat Sims and my loving sons  
William and John Nichols to be Executors of this my last Will and  
Testament In witness whereof I have set my hand affixed my seal  
the day and date as above.

At a Court Continued and held for Halifax County the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of April 1774

the Oaths of two of the Witnesses thereto was ordered to be recorded and on  
the motion of the Executor Certificate was granted him for obtaining a  
just Befief in due form giving security whereupon he with James  
Cobb and Abraham Lefland his securities entered into and acknowledged  
their Bonds with Condition according to law. And Matthew Sims one  
of the Executors herein named refused to take up on himself the burden  
and Execution thereof and liberty is reserved to the other Executor to join in  
indict
