I Will, first and principally I desire that all my just debts may be paid and my funeral expences fully discharged. I give and bequeath to my loving wife Amy Conner my plantation tools of every kind during her natural life and also my stocks of every kind excepting a cow and Calf and two of pigs that she must give to every one of my children when they leave her or she dies soon after her death the remainder shall be equally divided among all my children. I also give my wife my house & plantation with one hundred acres of land during her life, and after her decease I give and bequeath to my son Thomas my house with one third of my land lying in the middle of the tract to him his heirs and assigns forever, I give and bequeath to my Son Absalom one third more beginning from the upper end to him his heirs & assigns forever, I give and bequeath to my Son John the other third part of my land at the lower end to him his heirs and assigns forever. I also constitute my said wife Executive of my son Absalom, Moon Conner & William Hall Executors to this my last will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this forth day of December one thousand seven hundred & ninety eight.
