Daniel Stephen, Isaac, Jacob, Sam, Fanny, also the stock, household furniture & every other species of property he has heretofore received of me to him & to his heirs for ever - I give unto my son William Britton all the land I purchased of William Maney, John Maney & John Royal also that tract of land I have left my wife, after her decease also the following slaves Wm. Sam, Joe, Randall, Robin, Nancy & Judy, twelve head of cattle to consist of two work steers four cows four Calves & two heifers - four sows & pigs one henn called Farnought - sheep two beds & bedsteads seven pair of sheets nine Counterpanes six bed quilts - twelve towels - six pillow Cases - four pillows - six table cloths - four blankets - one iron pot one Dutch oven to him and his heirs forever - It is my will after the death of my wife that all the estate I have left her for life, except the tract of Land, be equally divided between my two sons Isham and William Britton - I hereby appoint my friends Benjamin Morton & Thomas Thweatt, as also my son Isham Britton executors of this my last will and testament, In witness whereof I have hereunto affixed my hand. Seal this twenty fourth Day of October one thousand seven hundred and ninety seven

JANUARY ELEVENTH 1799

Samuel Pointer one tract of land known by the name of Soneth Island, all
my other tract of land I bought of Richard Jones (Hyo) lying in Hys & Dan Rivers
also fifty acres of land now left to be taken off the tract I now live on reserved
as followeth, beginning near the spring on the land I bought of R. Jones there is a
straight line on the old road across to a stony hole above the blacksmith's shop
thence a straight line to the nearest part of Hys River thence down Hys to R.
Jones line thence to the beginning which said three tracts of land I give
to my son Samuel to him & his heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath to my other
son Samuel Pointer one negro man named Pool also one negro woman ^{named} Will one
feather bed and furniture to him and his heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath
to my son Philip Pointer the lower part of the tract of land I now live on
beginning on Dan River at Capt. Howerton's line thence up the river as it meanders
to the mouth of a gut or branch thence up the same as it meanders to the foot
of the hill thence up the branch to the second fork, thence a straight line to my cousin
white oak at the fork of the old ^{road}, thence down Howerton's line to the beginning to him
& his heirs forever, but if my son Philip should die before he comes to the
age of twenty one years then the said land to go to my son Henry Pointer to him &
his heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath to my son Philip one negro boy by the
name of Newman to be delivered him by the 25 day of December 1799 also
one Negro girl named Sally, ^{also} one bay mare ^{any} feather bed and furniture
to him & his heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath to my son William
Pointer one tract of land lying on Hys and Morgan Creek beginning at my son
Samuel's corner on Hys thence up his line to the stony hole above the sm'th shop
thence a straight line to a corner in a sington tree on a red oak thence along Avington's
line to a corner on a ween line near the stony old field thence down ween line to
Hys thence down Hys to the beginning to him & heirs forever but if my son
William should die before he comes to the age of twenty one years then the land
well to him shall go to my Eldest son that has no land by my will to him &
his heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath to my son William Pointer one negro boy
named Abram one Negro girl named Ruth and one feather bed and furniture to him &
his heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath unto my son Henry Pointer one Negro boy named
Edmon and one negro girl named Lucy, and one feather bed & furniture to him &
his heirs forever after I give and bequeath to my son Philip Pointer one negro boy named
Robt and one Negro girl named ^{Molly} to him and his heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath
to my son Thomas Pointer one tract of land wherein I now live beginning at the
old water mark of Dan River thence up Phillips line to the corner

White oak near the fork of the old road there along Haverston line to my corner
on Morris Creek thence down Arlington line to my son Williams corner thence
along his line to my son Samuels corner thence down his line to Dan River thence
down the river to the begining to him & his heirs forever but if my son Thomas
should die before he comes of age then the land given him shall go to the
Elder of my sons that has no land given him by my will to him and his
heirs forever Item I give and bequeath to my son Thomas Bristor one Negroe boy
named Manuel and one negro girl named Judith to him and his heirs forever
Item it is my and desire that three of my Negroes (to wit) London, Martha
and Hannah be immediately sold in my Executrix hands after named also one other
negro woman named Kate after my son Thomas comes of age to be held by him
for special use of my daughter Judith Jones during her natural life and
after her death the said negro to be equally divided between all her children
or their representatives to them and their heirs forever It is further my will
that my Executrix shall be vested with two feather beds & furniture which
shall be for the use of my daughter Judith Jones during her life and
after her death to be divided between all her children I leave unto my daug-
hter Judith one negro girl named Lorry for two years Item I give and bequeath
to my Daughter Elizabeth Hart one negro man named Dick one negro man
named Glasgow one negro woman named Charity one mare saddle and bridle &
one feather bed and furniture to her & her heirs forever To my will and de-
sire that my son Samuel do continue on my son Thomas tract of Land until
my son Thomas comes of age and keep my three youngest sons to wit Henry Joseph
Thomas, and that he have them well educated, for which purpose he is to have
the privilege of working all or any part of my said land until they respectively
comes of age and my son Samuel may and shall work the following negroes on said
land to wit old Abram Sutton Bristor, Sose, Katie, Amy, Ellis, Rachal,
Betsey, Lewis, Swift, five head of horses (to wit) Blazing fork, the saddle mare and
the young colt, and two yokes of oxen, also my son Samuel shall keep ten milch
cows of my stock thirty head of sheep and a dozen stock of hogs, for the maintenance
and education my three youngest sons and the money that shall be raised over the
maintaining of my said three sons shall be divided between all such

JANUARY 28th 1799.

My sons as as not have any part of my land, and should so many of my sons
die in this life before they come of age that all the living boys do inherit land
by my will then the money which may be rais'd shall be divided between
all my surviving Sons to them and their heirs forever. It is further my
will that when my son Thomas comes of age the following negroes to wit,
old Abram, Sartor, Sook, amey, Fiddis, Rachal, betsey Lewis &
Swift together with all my stock of all kinds then remaining be even-
ally divided between all my sons and my daughter Elizabeth Huest to
them and their heirs forever. It is further my will and desire that all
my house hold and cithen furniture not before given by this my last
will together with all my plantation utensils and all my grains of all kinds
remain with my son Samuel for the use of the family and when my son Thomas
comes of age then what is remaining be sold and the money equally divided between
all my children. It is further my will and desire that all my stock not be-
fore will together with my crop of Feb. bold and the money rising from the
sale after paying my just debts be equally divided between my sons and my daugh-
ter Elizabeth Huest to them and their heirs forever. and lastly I do appoint my
son Samuel Painter Executor of this my last will and testament In testimony

Jenkins the back of land I now live on two feather beds & furniture, & all my household furniture, guns and all my stock of all kinds horses cattle & sheep with my plantation utensils also my negroes namely York, aggy, Cate, Frank Beathieu & Jeffreys him and his heirs forever. In the fifth place, I give and bequeath unto my above mentioned daughter namely Anne Betty & Sally twenty shillings each in one twelve month after my decease, jointly & lastly I appoint my son John H.
