In the Name of God amen, I William Thornton her of the County of Halifax being in a low state of health and knowing it is appointed for all men once to die I declare this my last will and Testament and I do hereby revoke and annul all wills heretofore made by me - First I give my soul to God who first gave it to me in hope that he will receive the same at the general resurrection of the dead and as to my worldly things I give and bequeath in the manner and forms following - Item - To my beloved wife Lucretia Thornton I lend all the land and plantation wherein I live during his natural life - I also lend her six negroes to wit Kate and Grace and Liza and Sarah and Roger these I also lend her one feather bed ands furniture also six cows and also also 2 more one little since the a boy called Schuler I also lend her twenty head of hogs such as she may choose I also lend her ten head of sheep I also lend her all my kitchen furniture of all sorts I also lend her all my tables and chairs to see on - I also lend her one negro man by the name of Robin - Item - To my daughter Matthew DeChapman I lend 2 negroes by the name of Sam and Nancy during his natural life and at his death for the two negroes to be equally divided among the heirs of his body - Item - To my daughter Elizabeth Thornton I lend 2 young negroes by the name of Simon and Kate during his natural life and after his death I give them to be equally divided amongst the heirs of his body - Item - To my daughter Liza Parley I lend 2 negroes by the

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name of Hen and Hammer during his natural life and at his death I give them to be equally divided amongst the heirs of his body - Item - To my son Charles Thornton I give one tract of land by estimation one hundred and twenty five acres being the land whereon he now lives. I also give to him and his heirs for ever two young negroes by the names of Robt & Rachel. I also give him one bay mare - Item - To my son William Thornton I give one tract of land that Hugh of Woodstock, by estimation one hundred and fifty acres. I also give him one tract of land in Pittsylvania County which land I am now law for being by estimation two hundred acres. I also give him two young negroes by the name of Peter & Hen. I also give him one young mare here and one feather bed and furniture - Item - To my son Abner Thornton I give one half of the tract of land whereon I now live, at the death of his mother it being the lower end down the Creek. I also give him three negroes by the names of Anne, Charity and Sam. I also give him one mare mare by the name of Rebecca also give him one feather bed and furniture - Item - To my son Thomas Thornton I give the remaining part of the tract of land whereon I now live it being the upper part lying the state line with the hewn and a horse at the death of his mother. I also give him two young negroes by the names of Alice and Parvick I also give him one bay horse colt. I also give him one feather bed and furniture - Item - To my daughter Mary Clay I give two young negroes by the name of Charles and Luke. I also give her one horse and saddle I also give her one feather bed and furniture - Item - My will is that all the slaves that I have live my wife during life at her death shall be equally divided amongst my legates with all the other property that I have live my wife that shall remain at her death is to be equally divided amongst Elizabeth Thornton, Sam Doby, Charles Thornton, William Thornton, Yelston Thorton, Thomas Thorton and Mary Clay Thornton. My will is that my estate shall remain together till all my lawfull debts are paid - Item - My will is that my estate shall not be appraised - In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hands and affixed my seal this twenty second of Septr 1803 - I do officiate Mary Clay and Lucy Thornton heirs and sole executers of this my will and testament -

I give to my son Robert Salmon all the land lying south of my lane and the path leading to Wm Woods bar excepting my mill and six acres of land together with a fether bed & other property which he hath in possession

I give to my daughter Susana Bradshaw wife to William Bradshaw one bed & a new saddle which she hath in possession

I give to my wife Mary Wood wife to William Wood junr a fether bed & a new saddle which she hath in possession

I give to my son James Salmon the remainder of my land whome I now live being one hundred & one acre or less together with my mill and six acres of land during my wife's life to each of them for a possession together with all the rest residue and remainder of my personal estate provided my son James should pay all my last debts and after the death of my wife I give I bequeath the land so as aforesaid to my son James Salmon and his heirs and assigns forever together with my mill and the six acres of land and all the rest residue and remainder of my estate
