In the name of God Amen. I Abraham Regius of Halifax County
in the Colony of Virginia being sick and weak of Body but of perfect mind and memory
and calling to mind the mortality of my Body and knowing that it is appointed
time for all men to die have made constituted and ordained this my last
Will and Testament Vizt: First of all I Recommend to God who gave it a soul
body to be buried at the Discretion of my Executors; and as to such worldly Estate
as hath Pleased God to bless me with I do give annuo and dispose of in the
following manner. Imprimis I give and bequeath to my Dear Wife
Barbara all my moveable Estate Both Negroes Goods and Cattle to hold
to her during her Widowhood and if in Case she do not marry during her life
Except all one Cow and her Calf which my Daughter Phoebe has always
Claimed the same I bequeath to her and her heirs forever. I do bequeath
higher to my son Peter Regius and all black hies to my Daughter Sarah
to be Possessed by them and their heirs forever. I do bequeath to my Daughter's
I give and bequeath a Brown Cow. All the rest of my Estate I leave whole
and sell to be Possessed and Enjoyed by my loving Wife Barbara during her
Widowhood and in Case she do not marry during her life and after her
decease a manor to be Equally divided among my Children Except a
Negro Girl named Hannah with her Jewels I give to my Daughter Mary
Smith during her life and after her decease to be Equally divided among
her Children lawfully begotten to be Possessed by them for ever and I do make
her from any other division of my Estate Negroes, Goods, or Chattels I do
give and bequeath to my Wife Barbara all black man branded on the
Buttocks A and all the Cow marked the Right butlered and the left ear
marked to be at her disposal without Exception and I do make her
and constitute my Wife Barbara Regius the Ex^{or} of this my last Will &
Testament and I do utterly Abolish all other Wills and Testaments heretofore
made by me testifying this to be my last Will and Testament. In Witness
Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this nineteenth day of June
in the Year of our Lord Christ One thousand Seven hundred & Forty two

of the subscribing witnesses and drawn to be Recorded and on the motion
of the said Executrix who having first together with the said John Evans
and James Legrand her Jurors & friends entered into Bond as the Law directs
and acknowledged this same Certificate was granted her for obtaining
a probate of the said will in due form.

Being in Health & of sound memory thanks be to God all-
-mity and willing to remember the uncertain estate of this
transitory life and that all flesh must yield to Death I
do declare this to be my last Will & Testament in manner & form
following revoking & annulling by these presents all & every
Testament & Testaments Will & Wills, herebefore by me made
& declared either by word or by writing and this to be binding
by these presents that I John Justice Sr. that I give &
bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary all my Goods and
Chattel, and all movables that I am in possession of one
Harpin Creek as long as she remains my Widow likewise
unto my son Ezra Justice three hundred Acres of Land
and a Mill on it which is near the Home place. Likewise
unto my son William Justice one hundred Acres of Land
lying on Cogg River. Likewise unto my son John Justice
five Shillings. unto my son Simon Justice five
Shillings. and unto my son Thomas Justice five Shillings
and unto my Daughter Mary the wife of my son
John Justice five Shillings likewise to my Daughter Abigail
Thomas Watson five Shillings.
