the four Hundred Acres of Land whereon I now live
except what lies above the edge of the old mill pond and
a Chopt Line ^{also} my upper little I give to my loving

Daughter Sarah Hubbard and to her heirs and assigns
forever all that piece or parcel of Land that lies above
the edge of the Old mill pond and from thence following
the Branch up to the line between me and Benjamin
Dickson and thence along the line to the River and then
down to the mill I also give her one bed and furniture
I give to my loving Daughter Jary the lower part of
my back survey to her and her heirs forever already divided
by a line I give to my Daughter Pansyella Hubbard the up
half of the said survey and also a bed and furniture to her
her heirs forever and to my son Benjamin Hubbard I give
part of the Land that I first bought of Benjamin Dickson
to him and his heirs forever beginning at the new road
where it crosses the yellow bank creek and from thence
Down new Road to my line and from thence along my line
to Tountains line and thence along my line until it
Tountains line again and from thence along four corners
line to his corner and from thence along my line to a
corner hickory and thence along my line to the new
Road and thence down the yellow bank creek to the said
Road I give to my wife Hannah a privilege without
any interruption on the said place during the time of
her widowhood where she will and I also give her one
bed and furniture and also to my son Benjamin I give
Bed and furniture and to my love Daughter Hannah I
give the Land that I last purchased of Benjamin Dickson
excepting what lies over the yellow Bank Creek to her
her and her heirs forever and to my Daughter Rebecca I
give the remainder part of the Land that I last bought
of Benjamin Dickson to her and her heirs forever and to
my son Nathaniel I give the Land lying on Canastota River
that I bought of Eleggarny Baly to him and his heirs forever

I lend to my wife Hannah my Negro Sam during the
space of ten years except she marries and at the end of ten
years my will is that he shall be sold if he chooses it
and if chooses not to be sold I give him to my son
Beniamin and I also lend to my wife Hannah my horse
pounce and ten head of cattle which she may choose and
one cow and shotes during the time of her widowhood and
no more and all my house hold good Except my working
tools and them I leave to the use of my family the
rest to be Equally Divided amongst my six children
and my Land lying on Childrey creek and my waggon
I leave to be sold and my money due to me to be collected
and what I have by me all to be Divided Equally Divided
amongst my seven youngest children only my son
Nathaniel to have twenty pounds more than the rest
of them and my copper kettle which I have purchased
I lend to my wife Hannah during the time of her
Widowhood and if any of my children should dy with in
hears let their part be sold and Equally Divided amongst
the rest it is also my desire I do Accordingly constitute
and appoint Moses Hendrick and Joel Hubbard to be
the Executors of this my Last will and Testament Revoking
all others heretofore by me made in witness whereof I
have hereunto set my hand and Assigned my seal this
15 day of October 1770 seal and Delivd in presence of
