of the County of Halifax being sensible of the mortality of my body the
at present enjoying of my senses and aight years the which in body you
know and in this day of year and day I make and declare to be
to be my last will and Testament in manner and form following
to wit I command my body to the Earth from whence it was taken and
my soul to god who gave it unto me before whom I must stand before on
judgement in a coming day to answer for myself in that day and after
my Domestick affairs I leave in manner and form following Item
I leave to my beloved wife Elisabeth Earley during her life one negro
woman named Liddy and her youngest Child David and also one negro
David, and one feather bed and furniture and my grand mas
Snick and her riding Saddle two first choirs of Cows & Calves the
whole during her natural life Item I give and bequeath to my
son Daniel Earley the Land and Plantation whereon I now
live containing three hundred and Eighty five Acres more or less
and also negroes James and Rose with one feather bed and furni-
ture and the old man called Jeanny and his Filly Colt
and give him also all the rest I have by me and all debts
justly due to me with my Crop of Threes I have now in hand
the whole be his after paying off all my just debts and after
my wife has had the first choice in Cattle then for him to have
from the next choice with my work steers and Cart and also
any still the rest to him and his heirs for ever Item I
do make

I James Bailey on Bannister River whereon I now live contain-
ing two hundred & four acres more or less and one negro girl -
Sal and one Horse Colt being the gold of the old man Jeanny going
with Harrison how two head of cattle I command him to leave to
him and his heirs for ever Item I give to my Daughter Ann Earley
one negro named Hannah to her and her heirs for ever Item I give
to my Daughter Mary Ann Parker one Negroe named Harbley to
her and her heirs for ever Item I give to my Daughter Belavadom
one negro named George to her and her heirs for ever Item I give to
my grandson Robt Earley being the son of John Earley one negro named
Rachel to him and his heirs for ever Item I give to my grand Daughter
Elizabeth Earley the Daughter of John Earley one negro named Tom
to her and her heirs for ever As for my hogs and sheep and the working
cattle and the remainder of the Household furniture (Except my saddle and
my feather bed and furniture) stands but so farth as of the plantation
so long as my wife and Daniel live together and if they should dis-
agree and live apart the same to be divided between them at the
division of my Plantation when I shall name hereafter and my wife to
live herself so long as she lives and no longer. The balance of Negroe
(Except old Dick which I leave on the plantation to her use & well as
long as she lives) and the balance of cattle and my saddle and feather
bed (as I mentioned before) The whole to be made up of privately among
the Children and the money arising from them to be equally divided
among my Children both sons and Daughters to them and their heirs
My Will and desire is that my Estate should not be apaise @

In the name of God Amen the fourth day of November in the year of our Lord Christ One thousand seven hundred and eighty five I James Corin of Halifax County being very sick and make of body but of perfect mind and memory do make and certain this my last will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say after all my legal debts and funeral charges are justly paid I give and dispose of in the following manner and form Imparties I give unto my son Joseph Corin On dark bay House that goes by the name of Silver Eyes his choice of a feather bed and furniture to him and his heirs forever I give and bequeath unto my son George Corin one bright bay mare and by the name of Lady Tom's Colt and a feather bed and furniture his and choice to him and his heirs forever I give unto my son Henrie Wade one set of Table silver Spoons I give unto my Daughter Betsy Legendre one Gold Ring and all my wearing clothes the Ring to be made of hard wire of gold that I leave behind and to help for Army Estate I also direct that all the rest of my Estate consisting of Hous, Cattle, Hogs and Sheep and all my household furniture of every kind may be equally divided between my sons Robert Wade, Richard Wade and John Wade and Joseph Corin & George Corin in the following manner that it shall be lawfully apprais'd and then equally divided agreeable to the appraisement And I do hereby constitute and appoint my Friends George Boyd and John Faulkner Executors of this my last will and Testament entirely revoking and disannulling all other Wills by me made Confirming this and no other to be my last Will and Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 14th day of November 1785.
