 Executors nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection
 I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God
 and as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God
 to bless me in this life I give Devise and Dispose of the same in the
 following manner and form: it is my Will and I do Order that in the
 first place all my just Debts and Funeral Charges be paid and
