 do hereby make this my last will and testament in manner and form following that is
 to say I give and bequeath my Cape Horse to my daughter Fanny Poyner to
 her and her heirs forever. I do also give and bequeath to my two Daughters Mary
 Taylor and my above named daughter Fanny Poyner my white Horse called
 Dick and my three folding Beds and furniture and my stock of Hops Threepentle Spikes
 with the rest and residue of my whole Estate to be Equally Divided between them during
 their natural lives they paying of my just debts and funeral Expenses and after their
 decease I give and bequeath the above mentioned Estate to be Equally divided between
 my three grand children Thomas Poyner John Poyner and Lady Poyner to
 them and their heirs forever. I do also appoint my friends and neighbours James
 Gorington Executor with my above named two daughters Mary Taylor and
 Fanny Poyner to this my last will and testament hereby making all former wills by me
 heretofore made in writing whereof I have heretofore set my hand and seal 17th day
 January 1791 - The words 'daughters' interlined before assigned.
