In the name of God amen I Francis Boyd being in low state of health at present but of sound mind and memory do make and ordain this to be my last will and Testament in manner and form as follows, to wit, Item it is my will and desire that all my just debts first to be paid and the remainder of my estate after paying my debts as aforesaid I give to my beloved wife Claircy Boyd during her life or widowhood all my land that I now live on and at her death to be divided as followeth — Item it is my desire that at the death of my Wife or marriage that the land that I now live on be divided as followeth. Item I give & bequeath unto my son William Lason Boyd one third part of my land before mentioned and the other two thirds to be equally divided amongst my four daughters, to wit, May Belle Iron Boyd & Sourany Combs Boyd and Clarice Combs Boyd and Nancy Lason Boyd. — Lastly I do constitute and appoint my wife Claircy Boyd hereby and Sol Executor to my last will and Testament. — As Witness my hand and seal this twenty fourth day of October 1800.

JUNE COURT 1803

At a Court held for Halifax County the 24th day of January 1803

The within written Last Will and Testament of Francis Boyd deceased was exhibited in Court - and proved by the oath of two of the witnesses thereto subscribed - and ordered to be recorded. - And at another Court held for the said County the 27th day of June 1803 - The same was again exhibited in Court. - And on the motion of Claricy Boyd the Executrix therein named - who made oath according to Law. Certificate is granted her for obtaining probat thereof in due form - She giving security - Whereupon she together with Robert Terry and Moses Estes her bondsmen acknowledged their bond in the penalty of five thousand dollars - Conditioned as the law directs. -
